PUBLIC COMMENTS

No public comments were heard.

INTRODUCTION OF NEW FACULTY

Dr. Kendra Jeffcoat introduced Peggy Hudson, the new Director of Non-Credit and Community Services Programs. Mrs. Hudson received her Bachelors of Business Administration from the University of Oregon and her Masters of Arts, in Education Administration from San Francisco State University.

CCCT LEGISLATIVE CONFERENCE

Carlos Acuña stated that the theme of the CCCT Legislative Conference was "Accountability." The Legislature wants community colleges to show them what we are getting for the money, and are goals being met. All of us need to get involved with legislators to assist them in defining standards of "accountability."

Rudy Cardenas stated that he met with Assemblywoman Bonnie Garcia, who serves on the Assembly Standing Committee for Education. A dinner meeting took place with Senator Denise Ducheney.

Marian Long shared her experiences in attending meetings of the Under Funded Caucus and the Inland Valleys' Community College Trustees Association. Mrs. Long stated that the Governor's proposed community college budget preserves student access by including the following: +3.93% COLA; +3% enrollment growth; +1.89% for non-credit enrollment; \$20 million in one-time monies to expand 2+2 vocational curriculum. Equalization funding was not included in the Governor's budget.

SDICCCA ALLIANCE MEETING

Marion Long stated that the SDICCCA Alliance and other under funded districts have recommended the hiring of a legislative advocate to help with securing a growth formula and equalization. Ms. Long stressed the need for submission of editorials to our local newspaper outlining the need for equalization of funding, in an effort to educate our legislators.

ASSOCIATED STUDENT GOVERNMENT UPDATE

ASG President, Irene Garcia, reported the following:

- The Sweetheart Coronation will take place at the basketball game on Saturday, February 12, during half-time activities.
- Speakers for Women's History Month are being coordinated.

ACADEMIC SENATE UPDATE

Academic Senate President, Dr. James Patterson, reported the following:

- Approval was requested for Resolution No. 13198, Student Equity Plan.
- An ad hoc subcommittee has been established to investigate the question of separating the Curriculum Committee from the Instructional Council. The subcommittee will investigate the current Curriculum and Instruction Committee composition, looking at Curriculum Committee compositions at other institutions, interviewing key persons, and making a formal recommendation to the Academic Senate.
- Action was taken by the Senate to postpone the issue of realignment of Academic Services until Fall 2005.

WINTERHAVEN COMMUNITY EDUCATIONAL FAIR

Rebecca Ramirez expressed her gratitude to everyone that was involved in making the Winterhaven Community Educational Fair a great success on February 3. The Tribal President, Mr. Jackson, was especially pleased with the event, and is ready to assist in the organization of next year's event.

MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

Tom Hudson called attention to the monthly budget report for the month ending January 31, 2005, and that 58% of the major budget categories has been spent, which is on target.

PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

Dr. Pai reported the following:

- A luncheon meeting with Chancellor Drummond was held on February 9, at College of the Desert for the Inland Valleys' Community College Chief Executive Officers. Chancellor Drummond revealed the following points:
 - 1. There may be more Proposition 98 money for the Equalization.
 - 2. The Workgroup's Proposal will be refined before asking the under-funding caucus districts to reconsider it. The Chancellor intends to take this proposal forward to the Board of Governors in March.
 - 3. He has created a Chancellor's Business Circle, which is a foundation above all local district associated foundations.
 - 4. He urged districts to refrain from enrolling students automatically in non-credit computer lab courses that the students are not aware of.
 - 5. He works closely with legislature's leadership like Carol Liu on funding formula reform.
 - 6. He urges districts to sunset antiquated vocational programs but implement new on-demand programs. This echoes Department of Labor's call for new health science and information technology programs. IVC is on target to develop these in its master plan goals.
- HR 27 allocates \$250 million for Vocational Education Programs.
- Pell Grants will receive an increase according to President Bush's budget proposal.
- The SDICCCA Board Trustees Annual Dinner was held at the Del Mar Marriott on February 10. Trustees Marian Long, Carlos Acuña, Louis Wong, Shirley Hofer-Bell, and I attended along with forty other trustees, CEO's, and executive assistants to the Board. The Speaker addressed the need for Hispanics with college degrees. Board Alliance President, Marty Block and Constance Carroll, Chancellor of SDCCD reported the status of Equalization.
- The SDICCCA Alliance is organizing an appreciation luncheon in honor of outgoing Senator Dede Alpert on March 2, at the Prado in Balboa Park. Student representatives are encouraged to attend.

WHEREAS, the Imperial Community College District's 2005-2006 Budget development process began on February 1, 2005; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent/President agrees with the recommendation made by the Planning and Budget Committee (1/26/05), Academic Senate (2/3/05) and the College Council (2/7/05) to change the 2005-2006 Budget Development Guidelines and Process;

NOW BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby approves the 2005-2006 Budget Development Guidelines and Process, and directs that the budget be prepared in conformance with the following:

The Budget Development Process for 2005-2006 will flow from the Visioning process and Board of Trustees adopted Master Plan Goals (2/24/04).

The Master Plan Goals are:

- 1. Create a modern comprehensive Science and Technology Center. (Currently in the planning phase with financing provided by Bond funds.)
- 2. Develop a Distance Learning Center that provides faculty and curriculum development for online, interactive TV and hybrid courses to reach students whose access are hindered by factors such as distance, disability, scheduling, preference of learning style, etc. (Title V Grant has been received)
- 3. IVC will respond to community needs that address our evolving economic diversification.
- 4. Develop a long-term facility plan (Completed 3/10/04 and implemented with passage of Bond Issue)
- 5. Develop, implement and manage six day per week balanced class schedule applicable district-wide to meet the needs of our community (Implemented Fall 2004)
- 6. Give Imperial County high school graduates "primary" and residents "secondary" priority at the entry freshmen level. For those who are ready for college level courses, a full-time program is offered to graduate in two years, or four to six semesters depending on major preparation requirements. (Implemented Fall 2004.)
- 7. Implement community involvement by IVC.

2005-2006 BUDGETING GUIDELINES:

- 1000 Instructional Salaries to be budgeted by Human Resources, Business Services and Cost Centers. Departments are to schedule time with Human Resources to verify positions and salary amounts.
 - a. Increase instructional positions by 25
 - b. Curriculum and Instruction Committee to determine specific instructional allocations based on verified demand and classroom quotas.
 - c. Increase salaries subject to final negotiations.
- 2000 Increase Classified Salaries subject to final negotiations
 - a. Increase in support staff to be discussed by Administration and CSEA
- 3000 Increase Fringe Benefits subject to final negotiations
- 4000 Supplies and Equipment Increase 8% from 2004-05
- 5000 Services Increase 8% from 2004-05
- 6000 Capital Outlay will be budgeted by Budget and Planning Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the purpose of this compact is to establish a tuition reciprocity program to enable selected undergraduate students from California to enroll at designated community colleges in the State of Arizona with authorization to pay Arizona resident tuition rates, and to enable up to an equal number of selected students from the State of Arizona to enroll at Imperial Valley College with authorization to pay California resident tuition rates.

M/S/C Keithly/Cardenas ABSTAIN: Acuña Resolution No. 13197: **PARTICIPATION IN STATEWIDE EQUALIZATION CONSORTIUM PROJECT**

WHEREAS the Imperial Community College District (ICCCD) has been among the leaders regionally and statewide in efforts to equalize funding among California's 72 community college districts; and

WHEREAS ICCD Board President Marian Long has been actively participating in the San Diego and Imperial Counties Community Colleges Association Board Alliance to develop strategies to ensure that community colleges statewide receive the full \$240 million in equalization funds over three years; and

WHEREAS at a consortium meeting of the Underfunded Districts Caucus and Ring College Group held at Long Beach City College on December 15, 2004, the consortium voted to hire California Strategies, a firm based in Sacramento, to provide advice and strategy assistance for guiding the equalization efforts; and

WHEREAS participating districts will share the cost of the contract with California Strategies at \$5,000 per district; and

WHEREAS the agreement calls for California Strategies, LLC to do the following:

a. Design a strategy that would coordinate efforts of underfunded districts in advocating for equalization at \$80 million in the 2005-06 state budget.

- Design a strategy to develop and maintain bi-partisan legislative support for \$80 million for equalization in the 2005-06 state budget.
- c. Design a strategy to address the Proposition 98 split for community colleges.

BE IT NOW RESOLVED that the Imperial Community College District Board of Trustees hereby grants authority to the Superintendent/President to participate in this statewide consortium effort to help ensure equalization funding in the 2005-2006 state budget by sharing in the cost (\$5,000 per participating community college district) of a contract with California Strategies, LLC.
