PUBLIC COMMENT

Kent Hems, a citizen of Imperial County, spoke and stated he was speaking in favor of relocating the EI Centro Extended Campus adjacent to the public library and stated it was an item listed under closed session. He stated as an architect, developer, and property manager he has a lot of knowledge for what has been asked in terms of the state architect's standards. He stated he had concerns regarding the requirements for the building structure as education code does not require it. He stated he has worked extensively with the city and merchants of EI Centro and stated the move would benefit the City of EI Centro and the community.

	This revised notice is being sent to you to in order to identify the correct number of vacancies that you will be voting on in this election. The tenth vacancy is to fill the seat being vacated by Rebecca Garcia as her term is expiring. In accordance with the CCCT Trustees Board Governing Policies Section II, Officers/Executive Committee, as past-president she will remain on the board executive committee. I inadvertently excluded this vacancy from the count of open seats in the notice of March 3, 2008.

The election of members of the CCCT board of the League will take place between March 10 and April 25. There are <u>ten</u> two-year vacancies on the board.

Each member community college district board of the League shall have one vote for each of the <u>ten</u> vacancies on the CCCT board. Only one vote may be cast for any nominee or write-in candidate. The <u>ten</u> candidates who receive the most votes will serve two-year terms. In the event of a tie vote for the last position to be filled the CCCT board will vote to break the tie.

The 20 trustees who have been nominated for election to the board are listed on the enclosed sheet in the Secretary of State's random drawing order. An official ballot for the election is also enclosed in this mailing to each community college district chancellor/superintendent as well as copies of the biographic sketch form and statement of candidacy of each of the 20 candidates.

Please remember that: 1) ballots must be signed by the board secretary and board president or vicepresident; and 2) no identifying information or signatures on the ballot return envelopes. Official ballots must be signed and returned to the League office, **postmarked no later than April 25**. Faxed ballots will **not** be accepted. The ballots will be opened and counted by three tellers appointed by the CCCT President and the results announced at the CCCT Annual Conference.

INFORMATION REPORTS

Employee of the Month (January)

VP for Academic Services Kathy Berry spoke and stated the January employee of the month presentation would be postponed to next month's meeting.

Board Member Reports

Trustee Acuña reported the following:

He stated he had attended a conference and the main discussion was the budget. He stated it appeared the legislators had reelection on their agenda instead of Proposition 92. He stated some of the discussion and ideas were things IVC was already doing such as partnering with businesses. He stated that IVC needs to prioritize classes by eliminating those classes that are not well attended.

Trustee Galindo reported the following:

She reported she had the opportunity to review the high school rates. She stated the graduation rates from community colleges do not match stating she works for a large district and graduation levels do not show numbers. She stated some of the issues are lack of skills, especially basic skills. She stated she has had the opportunity to visit other schools and had spoken to Interim Superintendent/President Rodgers about model programs from Victor Valley College. She stated she would like IVC to look at some fast track programs as other community colleges have fast track LVN programs and some of the programs are geared for the working population. She stated some of the statistical information from IVC has not been produced and asked if the IT department could retrieve sound, palpable information so that success could be measured.

Trustee Hart reported the following:

He stated he was in Sacramento for five days at a conference and had the opportunity to meet some people that were helpful and was able to network. He stated that he learned IVC was one of many schools looking for a new president. He stated he had the opportunity to meet with legislators and discussed some ideas and issues that need to be addressed regarding IVC. He stated Assemblywoman Bonnie Garcia was aware of the proposed academy for state correctional officers at IVC. He attended the Inland Valley meeting during the Sacramento trip.

Associated Student Government Update

ASG President David Lopez reported the following:

- Today was the first ASG meeting of the spring semester.
- Announced there are six openings for senators and he would start interviewing from the 12 applications he received on Friday, February 22nd.
- High School Madness will take place at the mid winter fair on March 3rd and ASG will hand out information about student government.
- On March 17th, ASG will host a St. Patrick's event "IVC Idol."
- On March 18th and 19th, ASG will host the IVC Health Fair in the College Center.
- Congratulated tenured faculty and noted that out of the 13 receiving tenure, he had taken classes with four instructors.

Academic Senate Update

Dr. Bruce Seivertson reported the following:

- Announced the first academic meeting of the spring semester took place. He stated two topics will be discussed a lot during the semester Basic skills and Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs).
- On March 5th, an SLO coordinator will be appointed by the Academic Senate.
- Announced a Basic Skills coordinator will also be appointed.
- On April 11th, a spring academic senate fundraiser will take place which will be named the Spring Fling and it will be wine testing. He thanked instructor Russell Lavery for volunteering his home for the event.

Bond Sale Presentation

VP for Business Services John Lau introduced Leonard Cuenco of Caldwell Flores Winters, Inc (CFW).

Leonard Cuenco of CFW spoke and gave a history on the General Obligation Bonds Election of 2004, Series 2007C Summary of Bond Sale. He provided a handout to the Trustees and highlighted the following:

- Two of the factors that affect the bond sale are the credit rating and insurance and reported that S&P's credit rating for IVC is an "A-" and Moody's credit rating for IVC is an "A2."
- On October 18, 2007, CFW received three bids for the District's Current Interest Bonds and three bids for the District's Capital Appreciation Bonds. He stated the sale of the bonds at a lower interest cost will save money and will be passed on to the taxpayers.
- Originally, the bonds were scheduled to sell in 2016 and now this opportunity will allow eight years off the back of the loan and that is how taxpayers will save money.

Trustee Galindo stated that if IVC waits longer the impact would be negative as there would be more issues due to the water problems with the Imperial Valley.

Leonard Cuenco stated the sooner IVC can sell the bonds the better for savings.

VP Lau spoke and stated the collateral for the bond is property tax. He stated the bond is supported by the property of the entire Imperial Valley. He stated housing was down and commercial property is up. He stated this has given IVC a good position to maximize and float the bonds.

Trustee Medina asked when the anticipated sale would take place.

Leonard Cuenco stated there are \$10 million remaining and anticipated the sale in the summer.

Monthly Financial Report

VP for Business Services John Lau reported the following:

- Announced he would be presenting to the Board, at the next meeting, a snapshot of the budget and discuss different financial matters.
- The budget has been delayed until March. He stated he has been working with VP Berry.

- Conducted a walkthrough with the bidders for the science building today. He stated he would bring the bids at the next meeting and construction would start after the approval of the bids. He stated there are 12 bid packages and is expecting a good turnout.
- Gave a briefing for Resolution 14027 and 14028. He stated the resolutions were a partnership between the employee and the benefit. He stated the agreement would be to hold harmless IVC and establish the relationship between employee and vendor. He stated the law has changed and IVC will be the administrator and have the liability. He stated previously there was no concern; however, IVC now has concern with liability. He stated IVC would administer the plan as a third party. He stated these items were revenue neutral.

President's Update

Interim Superintendent/President Gary Rodgers reported the following:

- Discussed that IVC is evolving and stated IVC was no longer a small college, stating it was mid-size and going through some growing pains. He stated his general belief was that IVC needs a presence with our legislators in Washington, and named Senators Boxer and Feinstein and Congressman Filner.
- Stated IVC needs an ingress and egress with the entry into campus and has a cost of about \$4-5 million.
- Stated there is a buzz about homeland security monies to build an academy and is interested in seeing IVC have a full blown academy and believes a presence in Washington would take IVC in the right direction with legislators and monies for the academy. He stated Trustee Wong was proactive and set up an appointment with Congressman Filner. He stated administrators took the opportunity with Congressman Filner and presented him with a proposal.
- Reported on enrollment stating that the winter session increased by 9%. He stated spring enrollment has an increase of about 2% from last year.
- Stated that IVC's budget commitments are good for this year and stated that next year will need to be evaluated.
- Announced the six recommendations from the Accreditation Report. He stated there is a short timeline and staff is working on the recommendations. He stated the VPs have been present at a number for the shared governance meetings and taken an active role in the recommendation process.

VP for Academic Services Berry stated that there would be an instructional committee meeting to discuss short term goals. She stated there would two or three goals that would have top priority. She stated these short goals will allow IVC to guide budget allocations next year. She stated there is an annual report (ARCC) that needs to be submitted and stated an accurate data needs to be reflected on the report to allow for determination of priorities to students. She stated the Board needs to be involved in the next program review and it must be done by August of 2008. She stated the responses to the recommendations need to go to the Commission by October 15th and the Board would need to approve the recommendations at its September 2008 meeting. She stated faculty is ready to start writing for program reviews and a technology plan needs to be meshed along with a facilities plan that VP Lau and his team are working on as well as a resource allocation plan. She stated that though IVC is in a period of a downward economic time, IVC needs to keep moving this forward.

- Reported that the construction pad was finished for the science building and IVC received approval from the Department of General Services on the construction prints.
- A Police Chiefs meeting will take place tomorrow at 11:30 a.m. in the Board Room and there will be further discussion on the academy.

- The postponement of the Stakeholder's Summit was due to other events preventing participants from attending. He stated this will give the opportunity for the summit to be held when the new president arrives.
- He reported he is back in the classroom with three classes and has high enrollment.

M/S/C Medina/Acuña Resolution No. 14027: Third Party Administration Services, Tax Sheltered Annuity 403(b) Plan & 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the <u>Imperial Community College District</u> ("District"), designated as a governmental employer as defined in Section 457(e)(1)(A) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") as amended, has an existing Tax Sheltered Annuity (TSA) Plan that qualifies under IRC Section 403(b) ("the 403(b) Plan"), in which employees are permitted to make voluntary salary reductions; and to which the District may elect from time to time to make employer contributions on behalf of selected employees; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board has approved the adoption of a governmental non-qualified Deferred Compensation Plan that qualifies under IRC Section 457(b) ("the 457(b) Plan"), in which eligible individuals are permitted to make voluntary salary reductions; and to which the District may elect from time to time to make employer contributions on behalf of selected individuals; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board, District officials, or other District employees, make no representations or recommendations and bear no responsibility for any employee's/participant's selection of specific investment options made available under the Plans; and makes no representations to employees about the advisability, appropriateness or income tax consequences of participating in the Plan to which contributions are made.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Plans are intended to conform to the requirements of IRC Section 403(b) as amended and IRC Section 457(b) as amended, and
- **2.** Individuals who will be permitted to participate in the District's TSA 403(b) Plan and DCP 457(b) Plan are described in the Plan Document and Adoption Agreement for each Plan.

Administration and Compliance: The Governing Board authorizes the Superintendent/President or designee, to develop appropriate procedures to install necessary controls to insure that the Plans are operated in conformance with the Internal Revenue Code, including related regulations as currently stated, and as amended in the future.

The Superintendent/President or designee is the District's Plan Administrator for both Plans and is hereby authorized and directed to execute the actions necessary to properly establish and administer the Plans, including the selection or eviction of investment option providers for the Plans, and the entering into contracts or agreements as necessary to carry out the duties of the District's Plan Administrator, and where applicable, to execute procedures required to attain and maintain the qualified status of the Plans.

Third Party Administrator: To assist the District in meeting the above requirements stated in this resolution, the Board hereby authorizes and directs the Superintendent/President or designee, to engage the services of Envoy Plan Services/Keenan as the independent Third Party Administrator for both Plans.

Employer Contributions: As necessary and appropriate, the Governing Board hereby authorizes the Superintendent/President or designee to develop and implement employer contributions to the Plan; and to establish Administrative Policies that conform to the relevant regulations for those contributions.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: There is no fiscal impact to the District.

Resolution No. 14028: Elite Choice Governmental 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan and the Elite Choice 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity Plan

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of Imperial Community College District ("District"), designated as a governmental employer desires to adopt the new Imperial Community College District Elite Choice 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan, a governmental non-qualified plan that qualifies under IRC Section 457(b) (the "Elite Choice 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan") in which eligible employees and if specified, de minimus independent contractors, are permitted to make voluntary salary reductions; and the new Imperial Community College District Elite Choice 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity Plan that qualifies under IRC Section 403(b) (the "Elite Choice 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity Plan") in which eligible employees are permitted to make voluntary salary reductions.

Adopted Minutes

1. The Board hereby establishes and adopts the Imperial Community College District Elite Choice 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan which is for the benefit of Plan participants, and shall at all times, conform with the requirements of IRC Section 457(b), including assets of the Plan to be held in Trust for the benefit of Plan participants and their beneficiaries: and

2. The Board hereby establishes and adopts the Imperial Community College District Elite Choice 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity Plan which is for the benefit of Plan participants, and shall at all times, conform with the requirements of IRC Section 403(b): and

3. The Board hereby authorizes the Superintendent/President or designee, or his or her successor, as District 457(b) Plan Administrator and 403(b)/TSA Plan Administrator, and further authorizes him or her to implement and manage the Plans: and

4. The Board hereby authorizes the Superintendent/President or designee, or his or her successor, to enter into other contracts or agreements which he or she deems necessary or proper to administer the Plans; and

5. The Board hereby appoints and authorizes Union Bank of California, N.A., as Trustee of the Elite Choice 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan: and

6. The Board hereby appoints and authorizes Union Bank of California, N.A., as Custodian of the Elite Choice 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity Plan: and

7. Individuals who will be permitted to participate in the Elite Choice 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity and 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plans are described in the Plan Document and the Adoption Agreement for each Plan: and

8. Eligible individuals are given the opportunity to participate in the District's Elite Choice 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan and/or the District's Elite Choice 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity Plan by entering into an amendment of employment contract for the purpose of effecting a reduction in the salary paid to such participant.

Conformance: It is the intention of the members of the Governing Board that the District's Elite Choice 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan and Elite Choice 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity Plan will conform with the applicable federal and state statutory requirements, and that the participants' salary reduction contributions to the 457(b) DCP Plan and the 403(b)/TSA Plan be within eligible limits as set out in IRS regulations as currently stated, or as amended in the future.

This Resolution is hereby adopted and approved, authorizing the adoption of the Elite Choice 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plan and the Elite Choice 403(b) Tax Sheltered Annuity for its eligible individuals as described to be effective <u>February 21</u>, 2008.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: There is no fiscal impact to the District.

This Agreement dated February 20, 2008, is between COUNTY OF IMPERIAL, (hereinafter called "COUNTY") and IMPERIAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, (hereinafter called "IVC") each of which is sometimes hereinafter referred to as "PARTY" and both of which are collectively sometimes referred to as the "PARTIES"

WHEREAS, COUNTY has Imperial Valley Telecommunications Network (IVTN) demarcation points which were requested and approved by the Imperial Valley Telecommunication Authority (hereinafter referred to as "IVTA") but some of which the COUNTY never connected; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY pays IVTA for each demarcation point an annual sum whether the COUNTY uses the demarcation points or not; and

WHEREAS, IVC needs an additional demarcation point for its new facility to be located in the City of El Centro; and

WHEREAS, with the approval of the IVTA Board of Directors and upon payment of the agreed upon sum, COUNTY wishes to transfer a demarcation point from the COUNTY to IVC.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, COUNTY and IVC agree as follows:

1. DEMARCATION POINT. COUNTY offers use of its demarcation point located at the Seeley/Sunbeam Lake, and pending the approval of the Board of Directors of IVTA, will relinquish to IVC all rights associated therewith. In exchange for the receipt for this valuable consideration, IVC agrees to assume all obligations, including the annual assessment to IVTA, for the total payment of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to COUNTY for said demarcation point.

2. USE. The PARTIES agree that upon the execution of this AGREEMENT ("AGREEMENT") and subsequent approval by IVTA, the use of the demarcation point transfers to IVC, and IVC agrees to comply with additional terms and conditions as may be required by IVTA to assist with the

transfer of title to the demarcation point. COUNTY will no longer be responsible to IVTA for the annual payment for said demarcation point and IVC assumes all responsibility and liability for its use.

3. CARE AND MAINTENANCE OF DEMARCATION POINT. IVC acknowledges that the demarcation point is in the planning stage only and not yet constructed and that once the transfer is completed, COUNTY has no construction or maintenance obligations with respect to the demarcation point.

4. ORDINANCES AND STATUES. IVC shall comply with all statutes, ordinances and requirements of all municipal, state and federal authorities now in force, or which may hereafter be in force, pertaining to the use of the demarcation point.

5. INDEMNIFICATION.

5.1 To the extent permitted by law, COUNTY. agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless IVC from and against any and all claims, actions, demands, liabilities, damages, losses, and expenses of whatever kind, which are in any manner in whole or in part, caused, occasioned or contributed to in whole or in part, by any action, omission, fault, misconduct, gross negligence or negligence, whether active or passive of the COUNTY, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, licensees, invitees or anyone acting under its direction in connection with or incident to its obligations under this AGREEMENT or its construction, occupation, use and/or maintenance of the demarcation point or facilities located thereon, unless the same be caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of COUNTY..

5.2 To the extent permitted by law, IVC agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless COUNTY from and against any and all claims, actions, demands, liabilities, damages, losses, and expenses of whatever kind, which are in any manner in whole or in part, or which are caused, occasioned or contributed to in whole or in part, by any action, omission, fault, misconduct, gross negligence or negligence, whether active or passive of IVC, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, licensees, invitees or anyone acting under its direction in connection with or incident to its obligations under this AGREEMENT or its construction, occupation, use and/or maintenance of the demarcation point or facilities located thereon, unless the same be caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of IVC.

5.3 Notwithstanding Paragraphs 5.1 and 5.2, in the event that COUNTY and IVC are both held to be negligently or willfully responsible, COUNTY and IVC will bear their proportionate share of liability as determined in any such proceeding. Each side will bear their own costs and attorneys fees.

6.0 DEFAULT.

6.1 IVC DEFAULT. If IVC fails or refuses to perform any provision, covenant or condition to be kept or performed by IVC under this AGREEMENT, COUNTY prior to exercising any of its rights or remedies, shall give written notice to IVC of such default, specifying in said notice the nature of such default and IVC shall have sixty (60) days from receipt of such notice to cure said default. If such default is not cured within said sixty (60) day period, then COUNTY may in its sole discretion terminate this AGREEMENT and/or pursue those remedies available under the law of the time this AGREEMENT is executed as well as any future remedies that are created

6.2 COUNTY'S DEFAULT. If COUNTY fails or refuses to perform any provision, covenant or condition to be kept or performed by COUNTY under this AGREEMENT, IVC, prior to exercising any of its rights or remedies, shall give written notice to COUNTY of such default, specifying in said notice the nature of such default and COUNTY shall have sixty (60) days from receipt of such notice to cure said default. If such default is not cured within said sixty (60) day period, then IVC may in its sole

discretion terminate this AGREEMENT and/or pursue those remedies available under the law at the time this AGREEMENT is executed as well as any future remedies that are created.

7. NOTICES. Any notice which either party may, or is required to give, shall be given mailing the same, postage prepaid to the following:

Notices shall be deemed effective upon receipt. Except as provided herein any and all other communications by either party to the other shall be in writing and posted pre-paid first class to the addresses set forth herein, or as such other places as may be designated in writing by the Parties from time to time.

8. **AUTHORITY**. Each individual executing this AGREEMENT on behalf of IVC and County represents and warrant that:

8.1. He/she is duly authorized to execute and deliver this AGREEMENT on behalf of IVC and COUNTY as applicable.

8.2 This AGREEMENT may be executed in counterparts.

8.3 This AGREEMENT is made and entered into in Imperial County, California and shall be governed by the laws of California.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: The fiscal impact to the District is \$10,000 acquisition fee for the county, approximately \$15,000 for construction cost, and \$4,500 annual assessment.

M/S/C Medina/Acuña Resolution No. 14031: Agreement between the District and CSEA, Chapter 472

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board approves the following Agreement between the District and CSEA Chapter 472 as follows:

- A. The term of this agreement is for fiscal year 2007/2008 only.
- B. Article 16, Transfer and Reassignment, Section 16.1 to be amended so that the last sentence reads as follows:

The number of months that a permanent 10-month or 11-month classified employee works does not preclude a voluntary transfer to a lateral or lower transfer from a 10-month to a 12-month assignment.

C. Salaries:

Retroactive to July 1, 2007 there shall be an "on-schedule" salary increase of 5%. The salary schedule in the current MOU shall be amended to reflect this increase. Classified employees covered by this agreement shall receive the retro-active portion to their payment at the first full pay period following adoption of this agreement by the Board of Trustees.

Classified employees covered by this agreement shall receive a one-time payment equal to one and one-half percent (11/2%) of each's annual salary off-schedule. The one and one-half percent (11/2%) shall be computed based on members' annual salaries after granting the 5% on-schedule adjustment herein. This payment shall be made at the first full pay period following adoption of this agreement by the Board of Trustees.

- D. The retirement incentive program (SERP) pursuant to Resolution No. 13385 dated September 14, 2005 shall be extended through the term of this Agreement (2007-2008) provided said extension is in conformity with state law; and classified employees shall be eligible for the Golden Handshake for FY 2007/2008.
- E. Unit member benefits to remain status quo; and the District will maintain one hundred percent (100%) of health insurance premium coverage during the term of this agreement. District to continue to pay increased air and ground ambulance.
- F. Classified employees shall be entitled to serve as faculty adjunct professors. All classified employees so employed shall be paid at the standard adjunct rate of hourly pay.
- G. Revise Section 19 of the existing MOU per agreement of the parties.
- H. All other provisions of the existing contract are to remain the same unless otherwise modified herein, and this Agreement together with the existing contract constitute the entire agreement between the parties, and supersedes all previous agreements, understandings and prior practices related to matters included within this Agreement. During the term hereof there shall be no re-openers on any matter covered by this Agreement.
