VI.7 Resolution No. 13228: ENDORSEMENT OF ASSEMBLY BILL 317

WHEREAS, there is great disparity in funding per student among California's 72 community college districts, ranging from \$3,708 to \$8,186; and

WHEREAS, the lack of equitable state funding means that students in lower-funded districts have significantly less access to educational programs and services; and

WHEREAS, the Legislative Analyst's Office correctly states that "It is difficult to hold all districts accountable for (state performance) standards when the amount of funding provided per student varies from district to district;" and

WHEREAS, with the first installment of equalization funds in 2004-2005, the Imperial Community College District was able to provide increased educational opportunities for students by adding classes and increasing the number of full-time faculty; and

WHEREAS, without the second installment of equalization funds, the progress made in the first year of equalization will begin to erode and the funding gap will widen in 2005-06; and

WHEREAS, the Legislative Analyst's Office states that "The Legislature and Governor have already established that this (equalization) is an important goal, toward which they committed about one-third of necessary funding in the current year;" and

WHEREAS, the Legislative Analyst's Office further states that the "State's effort to equalize district funding should remain a high priority," and Assembly Bill 317, authored by Assembly Member Mervyn Dymally, would do just that.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Imperial Community College District strongly supports Assembly Bill 317 and urges the Legislature to support AB 317 for fairness and equity among community colleges.

WHEREAS community college teachers deserve the deepest respect and admiration of this community for their vital contribution to the well-being of our students;

WHEREAS the official day recognized as the California Day of the Teacher is May 11, 2005 and Week of the Teacher is May 9-13, 2005;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees publicly commends and thanks the teachers of Imperial Valley College for their dedication and hard work.

X.2 Resolution No. 13231: CLASSIFIED SCHOOL EMPLOYEES WEEK: MAY 15-21, 2005

WHEREAS, classified professionals provide valuable services to the school and students of the Imperial Community College District; and

WHEREAS, classified professionals contribute to the establishment and promotions of a positive instructional environment; and

WHEREAS, classified professionals serve a vital role in providing for the welfare and safety of Imperial Community College District's students; and

WHEREAS, classified professionals employed by the Imperial Community College District strive for excellence in all areas relative to the educational community;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Imperial Community College District hereby recognizes and wishes to honor the contribution of the classified professionals to quality education in the state of California and in the Imperial Community College District and declares the week of May 15-21, 2005, as Classified School Employee Week in the Imperial Community College District.

X.3 Resolution No. 13232: MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE DISTRICT AND IVC CHAPTER CCA/CTA/NEA

WHERAS, Article 16.4 of the Agreement states that unit members who serve as long-term substitutes for other unit members shall receive pro-rata pay; and

WHEREAS, special and unusual circumstances occurred in the Fall Semester of 2004 that required long-term substitution for an adjunct faculty member; and

WHEREAS, the District and the Association agree that the pro-rata pay rate should be paid to the substitutes involved in this particular case;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed as follows:

- Unit members Deidre Rowley and Daniel Trax shall be paid at the pro-rata rate for their long-term substitute service provided in the Fall Semester of 2004 for an adjunct faculty member.
- 2. This action is not intended to be precedent setting or establish past practice on this issue.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED that the Board approves this Memorandum of Understanding between the Imperial Community College District and the Imperial Valley College Chapter of the Community College Association/California Teachers Association/National Education Association.

### X.4 Resolution No. 13233: ADMINISTRATIVE CONTRACTS

WHEREAS, administrators employed by the District are initially hired under a one year probationary contract;

WHEREAS, in order to recruit highly competent individuals, and to retain said individuals, it is beneficial to the District to grant administrators a two-year rolling contract following successful completion of the probationary period;

WHEREAS, granting a two-year rolling contract to administrators who have successfully completed the probationary period would create stability on the District management team and would facilitate the budgeting process;
