CHANGES TO AGENDA

Board President Medina announced the following changes:

Change to Resolution No. 13814, last paragraph should state that the designated period is from **June 26, 2007** through **September 30, 2007**, not May 30, 2007 through August 31, 2007.

PUBLIC COMMENT

CSEA Chapter 472 President John Abarca thanked the Board for the recognition given to the classified staff during Classified School Employees Week, May 15-21, 2007.

CSEA Chapter 472 President John Abarca asked for the Board's support of Resolution 13814.

History Professor Eric Jacobson thanked the Board for the opportunity to travel to China. He stated that since Chinese history is an important part of the World History classes he teaches, the trip was beneficial from an academic standpoint.

WRITTEN COMMUNICATIONS

Board President Medina announced that the Board received letters from Financial Aid Technician Connie Anne Johnson regarding her resignation, and P.O.S.T. Coordinator and Administration of Justice Instructor Kelli Florman regarding her resignation.

INFORMATION REPORTS

Employee of the Month Presentation

Interim Vice President of Academic Services Gary Rodgers congratulated Nursing Instructor Jack Williams on being the April 2007 Employee of the Month. He stated that every VIP tour consists of a Nursing Division demonstration and Jack is always available. He stated that Jack is recognized as being available and helpful.

Kathy Berry spoke and stated that Jack is a dedicated person and has single handedly changed how nursing is taught. She stated she is pleased to work with Jack.

Board President Medina presented Jack with a certificate. Jack thanked the Board.

Board Member Reports

Trustee Long reported the following:

- She attended the Community College League of California 2007 Annual Trustees Conference held in San Francisco, May 4-6, 2007. She stated the highlights of the conference were:
 - Discussions about how to handle an active shooter with a rapid tactical deployment which would consist of a police officer standard trained person. She stated the Merced County Sheriffs Department gave the presentation and stated that the position would be considered as the first responder.
 - She handed out a flyer regarding SB361 Enhanced Funding Noncredit FTES and stated it was discussed at the conference. She stated IVC has 140 Noncredit FTES and she is impressed with those numbers.
 - She stated she could not stay for the Nancy Shulak meeting. She stated that Nancy Shulak was a reporter whom criticized community colleges about their performance. She heard that one attendee stated that Nancy Shulak stated that California's performance is lagging and that Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) need to improve.

Trustee Ramirez reported the following:

- She stated that the last day of computer classes concluded today and stated the Tribe was pleased that IVC was able to assist. She stated there were 25-28 students enrolled in the class and it included basic computer skills, Excel, Word 1, and Word 2. She stated it had been a long time since IVC participated with the Tribe and hopes that the participation will continue in the fall.

Board President Medina reported the following:

- Thanked the Board for their support in the trip to China. He stated that it was an educational trip and announced he had brought books and literature related to the trip for viewing.
- He presented a PowerPoint featuring highlights from their trip.
- He thanked YK America for their assistance throughout the trip.
- He thanked History Professor Eric Jacobson, Interim Vice President of Academic Services Gary Rodgers and Superintendent/President Dr. Paul Pai for making the trip enjoyable.

Interim Vice President of Academic Services Gary Rodgers commented that they signed an agreement at a university to explore exchange programs.

Associated Student Government Update

ASG President Frank Fernandez reported the following:

- ASG held its presidential election and had the highest turnouts in recent history. He introduced David Lopez as the new ASG President. He stated David is the current Parliamentarian and has been on the Senate for one semester and has done a lot for the students. He announced that elections were not held to fill the senior senate seats because they did not receive enough applications to warrant an election.
- The Steering Committee for the visioning process held campus focus groups this week and students facilitated all three sessions.
- The annual "Life's a Beach" theme event will be held next Wednesday, May 23rd at the pool.
- The Spring Awards Banquet to honor students will be held Friday, June 1st, 6:30 p.m. at the Barbara Worth Country Club.
- ASG's handbook is continually being updated and ASG has found that the nurses have been neglected because currently they cannot be officers of campus clubs. The ASG Senate will be updating the Campus Organizations Act at future meetings.

Academic Senate Update

Dr. Dennis Carnes reported the following:

- Emergency Awareness has been an item the Senate has been discussing. The Senate has reviewed reports on what IVC does and does not have in place and what to expect in an emergency situation.
- The Senate is discussing an increased role for adjunct faculty.
- The Senate is discussing student housing on campus and encouraging the district to investigate construction of housing that would encourage athletics and agriculture students to enroll at IVC.

- Action will be taken on creating a Student Learning Outcome (SLO) Committee. He stated that leadership should be invested in the existing structure by Division Chairs and the Vice President of Instruction.
- He announced it would be his last Board meeting as Academic Senate President. He stated he was optimistic with IVC and hopes that IVC takes the opportunity to develop the growth, as well as the leadership that is important to the campus. He introduced Geography Professor Dr. Bruce Seivertson as the new Academic Senate President.

Dr. Seivertson introduced himself to the Board. Board President Medina welcomed and congratulated him on his new position.

Monthly Financial Report

Interim Vice President for Business Services Dick Fragale reported the following:

- IVC's budget is in stable condition. He stated that the Business Office is working on the 2007/2008 budget. He stated that the percentage holdings at 7.8 – 8.0% are still in line for reserves. He stated that all monies requested by division chairs and instruction have been allocated. He stated that the Academic Services budget has increased by one third.
- Bond Update. The science building plans have been received from the Department of State Architecture (DSA) with minor corrections.
- The bid for the first phase is expected to go out mid June. The current work that is underway will be completed by the end of June.
- Granite Construction has been contracted to remove the concrete from the gallery site. The IVC construction class will be reconstructing the gallery.

President's Update

Dr. Paul Pai reported the following:

- He thanked the Board for the opportunity to participate on the trip to China. He stated that the trip was fruitful as there is interest in moving forward with having relationships with Chinese universities in particular three that expressed interest: Zhengzho's Kaifeng University, Northwest University in Xi'an, and Fudan University in Shanghai. He stated that the exchange could be of both faculty and students. He passed out a copy of the Cooperation Agreement between Kaifeng University and IVC. He stated he would be taking this information to shared governance bodies to work out a plan.
- He announced that the State budget revision has been posted. He stated the recommendation was to cut the total budget of \$80 million. He stated that the growth is set at 2% not 3%. He reported that while IVC was growing, San Diego was stagnant in growth and now the opposite is happening.
- Thanked faculty and staff for their work. He stated that administrators worked behind the scenes to make the Day of the Teacher a great event.
- Thanked ASG President for taking the lead and a role in the visioning process. He stated that he is happy to see students engaged in the process.

Financial Aid Report

Vice President of Student Services Dr. Victor Jaime introduced Dean of Financial Aid & State Programs Jan Magno. She passed a handout titled Financial Aid Six Year Trend 2000-2006 and CAL Grant High School Outreach Program 2005-2006. Highlights were:

- Work study is shrinking due to the minimum wage increasing; however, IVC is and will continue to make the minimum state wage
- IVC ranks 5th in the state for the BOGFW (Fee Waiver)
- One of the Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) the Financial Aid Office will be developing is to show the students the process of the financial aid application so that the student will be able to take those skills and use the knowledge for other applications
- High school students that have completed a FAFSA application were 45% of students in the Valley compared to 9% in the state
- Cal Grant B or C awarded to Imperial Valley students were 35.6% of students in the Valley compared to 16.1% in the state

Business Presentation

Interim Vice President of Academic Services Gary Rodgers introduced Business Instructor Angie Ruiz as the faculty advisor on campus for the Business Club. She introduced club members that were present and presented a PowerPoint presentation. Highlights were:

- Purpose of club is to educate and promote the club and the members
- Fundraising is part of the club's activities through a recently purchased Churro Machine of which \$4,000 was donated by the IVC Foundation
- Salton Sea International Bird Festival hired the club to do their registrations for the event and this exposes the members to customer service and real life scenarios
- Members visit Valley organizations which expose them to businesses
- Members experience culture from traveling to Puerto Vallarta, Mazatlan, and other places as well as students preparing for the trip and paying part of their trip
- Customer service focus is needed in the Valley

Vice President of Student Services Dr. Victor Jaime introduced Business Club member Ada Ceballos who resigned as custodian from IVC to finish her college education.

WHEREAS part of the mission of the Imperial Valley College Upward Bound and Talent Search Programs is to provide students with academic guidance and motivation to become knowledgeable and prepare them to enroll for post-secondary education.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board approves the recommendation of the Superintendent/President upon the recommendation of the Vice President for Student Services and the Directors of the Upward Bound and Educational Talent Search Programs, the establishment of an Outreach Counseling Specialist position in accordance with the objectives of these two Title IV categorical grants from the U.S. Department of Education.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Outreach Counseling Specialist position be effective May 17, 2007.

Objective

The objective is to employ individuals who have training and experience working with students at the local middle and high schools.

The job of the Outreach Counseling Specialist will be to provide academic guidance; career and college exploration, college preparation workshops, financial aid assistance, and other related tasks so that the participants become knowledgeable about preparing for college.

Duration

The Outreach Counseling Specialist may be employed for the duration of the Title IV Educational Talent Search and Upward Bound Grants or depending on the availability of grant funds. The Outreach Counseling Specialist is not to exceed twenty one (21) hours a week.

Qualifications

The individuals employed under the Outreach Counseling Specialist position, will possess the following minimum qualifications:

1. Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution in counseling, rehabilitation counseling, clinical psychology, guidance counseling, educational counseling, social work, human relations, liberal studies, social science or career development;
2. Sensitivity to students of various academic, socioeconomic, cultural, religious, disability, and ethnic backgrounds;
3. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with students, parents, faculty, and staff;
4. Bilingual skills preferred.

Compensation

The Outreach Counseling Specialist shall be compensated in accordance with the following hourly rates, which are based on Outreach experience:

Responsibilities

1. Be proficient and knowledgeable in the subject area;
2. Provide assessment and course placements;
3. Provide opportunity and encouragement to learn;
4. Assume responsibility for adequate preparation and prompt evaluation of progress reports, report cards, and transcripts depending on quarter, semester, and yearly evaluations;
5. Provide individual and small group instruction, and provide direction and understanding of the homework assignments to the program tutors (Lead and Peer tutors);
6. Required to attend one staff meeting per week;
7. Provide weekly documentation on all participant contacts, including student signatures where needed.

Assessment

The Outreach Counseling Specialist works under the direction of the Vice President for Student Services, and the Title IV Educational Talent Search and Upward Bound Program Director(s). The Program Director(s) will assess the Outreach Counseling Specialist through direct observation with program participants. Use of guidance strategies and methodologies will be evaluated.
