#### INTRODUCTION OF NEW CLASSIFIED

Dr. Marion Boenheim introduced Wayne Spears, Career Development Specialist for the Disabled Students Programs and Services Department. Mr. Spears started his new job on April 11. For four years Mr. Spears has worked as a part-time Instructional Specialist performing a variety of duties. He has served as an instructor on the Mobile High Tech Bus, teaching basic computer skills to disabled high school students. Also, he has been an instructor at the Imperial Valley blind Center teaching basic computer skills to older disabled students. He has provided support services such as test proctoring to disabled students on campus. Before relocating to Imperial Valley he worked for ten years as a vocational counselor with the State of Nevada Employment Department in Reno. In his new position, he is responsible for designing and implementing an employment program for disabled students called Workability III, which is a partnership program between IVC and the Department of Rehabilitation.

### CCLC ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Marian Long and Rudy Cardenas attended the Annual Trustees Conference sponsored by the Community College League of California on April 29-May 1. Mrs. Long shared the following information:

- The Under Funded Caucus met on April 30, and heard an update on strategies for equalizing funding from former Senator Jim Brulte. The latest information on the progress of AB 317 (Dymally) relating to community college finance, and AB 361 (Scott) equalization funds to community college districts, was presented.
- Capitol Days 2005 will take place on May 17 and June 21, and will bring community college advocates from across California together to lobby the Legislature for a unified community college budget message.
- Mrs. Long is making a recommendation to Assemblywoman Bonnie Garcia that Copper Canyon Community College District Trustee, Eva Kinsman, be appointed to the California Community Colleges Board of Governors.
- The Imperial Valley transfer rate is fourth from the lowest in the state at 16.37%. Mrs. Long stated that she wants IVC to take steps to improve in this area.

• The May Revise was released by Governor Schwarzenegger which increased the community college budget by \$83 million. The significant increase raises the community college share of Proposition 98 to 10.46%. There will be no increase to the student fees, \$40 million of equalization funding, 3% for growth, and \$15 million increase (4.23%)for COLA

Trustee Rudy Cardenas stated that many community college districts throughout the state are making cuts to their budgets. IVC is very fortunate to be doing better than most community colleges. Executive Director David Viar is leaving the Community College League of California to assume the position of President of American River College. The League honored 41 trustees who have served as trustees for twenty years or more.

## ASSOCIATED STUDENT GOVERNMENT UPDATE

Newly elected ASG Senate President, Nancy Ramirez, updated the Board on the following:

- Faculty and staff were thanked for their support in making the annual Spring Awards Program a success.
- The last ASG Senate meeting for the year was held on May 16. The ASG continues their work to develop an activity calendar for the next academic year.
- The annual "Life's A Beach" activity will take place on May 20 from 10:00 A.M. to 2:00 P.M. at the swimming pool complex.

## ACADEMIC SENATE UPDATE

Academic Senate President, Dr. James Patterson, reported on the following:

- At the May 4 Senate meeting approval was given for the two-year development calendar for the IVC Accreditation Study.
- The Senate continues to lead the campus community in the development, design, and assessment of Institutional Student Learning Outcomes and has developed an Assessment Plan for 2005-2006.
- At the May 18 Senate meeting action will be taken on the 2005-2006 District Budget, curriculum recommendations, and the presentation of the Rafael Santos Outstanding Professor Award.

# MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

Carlos Fletes called attention to the monthly budget report for the month ending April 30, 2005, which reflects 84% of the major budget categories have been spent, which is on target.

#### PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

Dr. Pai reported the following:

- On May 3, IVC faculty, staff, students, and administrators participated in a very successful Calipatria/Niland Community Education Fair at the new Calipatria High School Gymnasium. Around 1,000 students from local elementary, junior high and high schools participated in a scavenger hunt which created an avenue for interaction between those representing IVC and the students. Trustee Rom Medina thanked the IVC community for providing his area with this outstanding outreach effort.
- On May 6, Dr. Pai attended the Southern California Consortium of Hispanic Serving Institutions meeting at California State University, Fullerton. Tomas Rivera Policy Institute President Harry Pachon and Hispanic Scholarship Fund President Sara Martinez were the guest speakers. IVC has ten students receiving Hispanic Scholarship Fund scholarships in the amount of \$1,150.00 each.

WHEREAS the IVC Student Equity Plan, Goal 1, called for the "development of the job description and request for approval and funding to the ICCD Board of Trustees" to be "jointly prepared by the Vice President for Academic Services, Vice President for Student Services, President of the Academic Senate, and Chairperson of the College Council;

NOW BE IT RESOLVED that the Board approves the establishment of a Student Equity Coordinator as follows:

SELECTION:

The Student Equity Coordinator will be selected annually by the Vice President for Student Services, Vice President for Academic Services, the President of the Academic Senate, and the Chairperson of the College Council, selected from the full-time, tenured faculty.

COMPENSATION:

The Student Equity Coordinator will receive a \$4,000 annual stipend effective July 1st of each year.

**RESPONSILIBITIES:** 

• The Student Equity Coordinator will work with the Institutional Researcher to collect data on the identified student population groups related to (1) Access, (2) Course Completion, (3) ESL and Basic Skills Completion, (4) Degree/Certificate Completion, and (5) Transfer. For each of the five areas, the collected data is expected to demonstrate trends and patterns among the identified student population groups. These trends and patterns, viewed over time, are expected to give the campus a better understanding of how the identified student population groups are (or are not) being served by the campus.

- The Student Equity Coordinator will report her/his findings to the Academic Senate, College Council, Administrative Council, and Board of Trustees. Reports to the Academic Senate, College Council, and Administrative Council should be given at least once each semester. The Student Equity Coordinator should report to the ICCD Board of Trustees at least once each academic year.
- The Student Equity Coordinator will work with the Academic Senate and College Council to develop goals and/or activities to respond to the trends and patterns exhibited in the collected data for the identified student population groups related to (1) Access, (2) Course Completion, (3) ESL and Basic Skills Completion, (4) Degree/Certificate Completion, and (5) Transfer.
- Depending on the trends and patterns expressed by the collected data, the Student Equity Coordinator, Academic Senate, and College Council may arrange possible responses up to and including "extensive" objectives and/or activities.
- The Student Equity Coordinator will prepare a Student Equity Plan report annually, reporting on the data collected, the meetings with the Academic Senate, College Council, and Administrative Council, and the goals and/or activities of the campus for the identified student population groups related to (1) Access, (2) Course Completion, (3) ESL and Basic Skills Completion, (4) Degree/Certificate Completion, and (5) Transfer. The annual report is expected to provide an update on the status of data collection, review, development of goals and/or activities, and any shifts in the trends and patterns within the identified student population groups related to the target areas.
- The Student Equity Plan will need to be prepared and approved by the appropriate bodies according to a schedule based upon potential due dates established by the Chancellor's Office for California Community Colleges.
- The Student Equity Coordinator will be supervised/ monitored by the Vice President for Student Services.

Furthermore, a unit member whose course is canceled reserves the right to maintain unit load level up to two (2) courses or nine (9) units, whichever is greater, by replacing the canceled course with an adjunct instructor's course.

# M/S/C Cardenas/Medina Resolution No. 13267: AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DISTRICT AND CSEA CHAPTER 472

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board approves the following Agreement between the District and CSEA Chapter 472 as follows:

## Article 13, Holidays

CSEA agrees to exchange two District-paid holidays, the Friday before and the Monday after Easter Sunday, for three (3) District-paid holidays during the Spring Break.

## Article 14, Spring Break

For the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 academic years, the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of the Spring Break shall be designated as paid holidays for the classified bargaining unit members. The dates during the 2005 -2006 Spring Break designated as paid holidays are April 17, 18 and 19, 2006. The dates during the 2006 - 2007 Spring Break designated as paid holidays are April 9, 10 and 11, 2007.

The remaining two (2) days of the Spring Break, shall be taken as vacation, comp time, PN leave, or no pay by the classified staff.

## Classified Salary Schedule 3, 2004-2005

The classified salary schedule is not equitable as it currently stands. Therefore, to align all ranges and steps the salary schedule shall be modified by an average of 2.48% (see modified schedule attached as Exhibit A).

## Resolution No. 13268: AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DISTRICT AND CSEA CHAPTER 472

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board approves the following Agreement between the District and CSEA Chapter 472 as follows:

A. Implementation of a new classified salary schedule as reflected in Exhibit A attached.

The new salary schedule is partially comprised of the 2004 - 2005 classified salary schedule, which has been modified by an average of 2.48% to align all ranges and steps so that the difference between each range is 3% and step is 5%. The 2004 - 2005 modified salary schedule contains 64 ranges (Range 01 to Range 64) and

12 steps (Step A through Step L). The new classified salary schedule consists of 35 ranges and 14 steps, Range 01 through Range 31 and Step 1 through Step 14. The ranges on the new salary schedule correspond with Ranges 17 through Range 48 of the modified 2004 - 2005 salary schedule, and Step 1 through Step 12 correspond with Step A through Step L of the modified 2004 - 2005 salary schedule.

All classified employees shall advance annually on the new classified salary schedule on their anniversaries until Step 14 of the salary schedule is reached. Employees whose anniversary dates are between July and December shall advance in July. Employees whose anniversary dates are between January and June shall advance in January. No further increases will occur after Step 14 except for COLA and/or any future revisions to the salary schedule.

Only those current classified employees scheduled to receive longevity increases in July 2005 and January 2006 shall be granted longevity increases. Thereafter, no longevity increases shall be granted to any classified employees.

Either through the employment process or a transfer, a classified employee shall move to the new range and to a step that is at least 5% above the employee's current salary, not the same step held in the previous classification.

B. Salary Increase:

Fiscal Year 2005-2006: 10% on-new schedule salary increase effective July 1, 2005 Fiscal Year 2006-2007: 5% on-new schedule salary increase effective July 1, 2006 Fiscal Year 2007-2008: 5% on-new schedule salary increase effective July 1, 2007

- C. Maintain total health insurance benefits at the current level for classified employees and retirees hired prior to July 1, 2005.
- D. The monthly vacation accrual rate for twelve (12) month employees shall be increased from 6.64 hours to 8.0 hours from the hire date through the third year of service.

- E. Effective July 1, 2005, reclassification requests for all positions may be submitted at any time. The effective date of a reclassification shall remain July 1 of the year following the fiscal year in which the request was approved.
- F. In the event the Imperial Community College District does not receive the anticipated 8% increase in funding for the 2005-2006 academic year when the California State budget is signed, Article 8, Salary, and Article 10, Insurance, shall be re-negotiated in such a way as to preserve the financial balance of the District.
- G. This new successor agreement shall be in effect from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2008. The parties agree to reopeners on health and welfare benefits for 2006 and 2007. This agreement is entered into on the date shown above and is conditioned upon:
  - Receipt of funding from the State of California; and
  - 2. Approval by the bargaining unit and the District Board of Trustees.
