CORRESPONDENCE

OPTIONAL STUDENT FEE PAYMENT PLAN

Carlos Fletes reviewed the proposal of establishing an Optional Student Fee Payment Plan. IVC currently has uncollected student enrollment fees exceeding \$700,000. Historically the College has not required students to pay their fees when they register, so not to deter to a student registering. Collection of outstanding fees was given to COTOP which is very slow in reimbursing and only collects 75%.

The Admissions Operating Committee is endorsing the concept of an Optional Payment Plan and to contract with a company such as FACTS Management Company that specializes in collecting student fees through a payment plan at a flat fee of \$20 per term per account. The fee would be paid by the student so there is no cost to IVC. This plan is totally voluntary for the student, and funds are transmitted weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly to the College. The benefit to the College is that student fees will be collected in a timely fashion, and there may be a possible increase in enrollment as students learn that there is a structured payment plan available. The company that is being proposed is currently being used by Sierra College, College of the Sequoias, Victor Valley, Chabot/Las Positas and San Bernardino Community College Districts. It is estimated that 43% of students do not pay their fees.

M/S/C S. Lopez/C. Ramirez that the College Council makes a recommendation to the Superintendent/ President to move forward with the Optional Student Fee Payment Plan to be implemented the Winter/Spring 2007 Semesters.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:32 p.m.
