#### **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

## A. IVC Field Day – Update and completed tasks (W. Love)

P. Pauley reported that IVC Field Day is coming along nicely. He also announced that volunteers are needed to help with supervision and collection of tests. A brief synopsis was given by P. Pauley on the history of IVC Field Day.

W. Love reported that six contests are planned for this event. First hour will have two contests and the other four will be after thus, giving students (freshmen) the opportunity to participate in two contests. Registration, lunch and awards will be in the amphitheater area (next to the Library). Rooms 203, 211, 212 and 1308 have been reserved for contests. A room to do the tabulations is still needed. # A. Purchase Prioritization

- P. Pauley read email he received from G. Huerta pertaining to Perkins Funding. Email states that the business office will not process P.O's after March 31, 2009. YTD report will be sent out on programs allocation of CTEA funds for 08-09 and they are requesting a detail and specific plan for re-allocation of unencumbered 08'09 funds. Funds not used will be lost.
- P. Pauley met with gentleman who owns Queen Gil Drip Irrigation Systems at World Ag Expo and he offered to provide the material to install a drip system in our field for 50%. Cost is estimated at \$16,000. Combined funds from Perkins and State can be used to purchase system which will cover tape and filter system (not pump). A. Kalin suggests contacting Alex Jack regarding installation of drip system. Discussion followed.

- P. Pauley suggests establishing a priority list for equipment needed. He stated that there are approximately \$18,000 left in Federal and \$20,000 in Other for a total of \$38,000. Purchase of a pump was suggested. Discussion followed.
- S. Collins asked if anyone was interested in job shadowing H. S. teacher.
