




## **Hall of Fame Dinner a Success!**

The IVC Foundation will be initiating a mini-campaign designed to take advantage of this once in a lifetime opportunity to double all of our scholarship donations over the next 16 months. The end result could be a total endowment of over \$600K for IVC students!! (For every \$20K put in endowments; interest earned equals the annual student tuition at IVC - \$1,000).

## **Book Loans now Book Scholarships**

Campus - The popular Book Loan program at the Foundation has turned a new leaf and is now being offered as Book Scholarships. Last Spring the Foundation loaned \$5.800 out to students who often had difficulty paying it back. This Spring the Foundation is issuing \$1,000 of true scholarships. Applications are in the Financial Aid office.

**Scholarship** El Centro - It hasn't been easy for this initial recipient of the Mary Shinn Memorial Scholarship. Claudia Rodriguez (see right) is a single mother who is attending IVC not just for her

goals, but also for the future goals of

her daughter that she raises with her siblings and three generations in their modest home.

Claudia and Sarah Clark are the first IVC students to receive \$500 each from this scholarship that was started by long time Imperial Valley educator Jim Shinn and his partners in the SonShine Counseling Center.

A new motivation has compelled Claudia in her guest to obtain her education, "All my choices and decisions will not just impact my life, but also the life of my child."
