I. Call to Order (M. Heumann)

II. Welcome and Introduction (M. Heumann)

Introduction of full-time temporary faculty member Diana Ferrell who is teaching reading and writing for us this semester.

A. Evaluation of Spring 2011 Scheduling

A concern was addressed at this time regarding the fact that there are some faculty members who were hired only to teach reading. Michael reassured the division that was not going to happen in the immediate future, but it was something to keep in mind as we move forward.

B. Reorganization and Chain of Command (M. Heumann)

If a student has a complaint with an instructor, they need to talk with the instructor first; if the situation cannot be cleared up with the instructor then they see the Department Chair, Michael. Meetings with high school instructors will continue this year.

High School teachers have come out to take the Accuplacer test. They're working on strategies on grading essays.

There will be a meeting on September 30th at Southwest High School. They will pick up where they left off last spring.

D. Program Review: Transfer-level and Literature (M. Heumann) Program Review is done every three years.

This year we will be doing the transfer-level courses.
