V.5. Resolution No. 14450: Child Development Fund use of Reserves for Cash Flow purposes

WHEREAS, currently Imperial Valley College has Fund 120 with the County of Imperial Treasurer's Department for the purpose of accounting for Child Development Fund Reserves, and

WHEREAS, currently Imperial Valley College has Fund 045 with the County of Imperial Treasurer's Department for the purpose of accounting for Child Development regular operating activities, and

WHEREAS, during any given month of any fiscal year, Fund 045 may experience cash flow needs to satisfy day-to-day operations, and

WHEREAS, any and all funds transferred for this purpose must be returned to Fund 120 before the end of any given fiscal year;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Imperial Community College District Board of Trustees authorizes the Superintendent/President and/or the Vice President for Business Services or designee, to transfer funds as needed between Funds 120 and 045 to make sure that both funds maintain a positive cash flow balance.

V.6. Resolution No. 14451: First Amendment to Healthcare Services Agreement

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board approves the following agreement:

FIRST AMENDMENT TO HEALTHCARE SERVICES AGREEMENT Imperial Community College District and Pioneers Memorial Healthcare District

This First Amendment to Healthcare Services Agreement is effective as of August 1, 2009, by and between Imperial Community College District ("ICCD") and Pioneers Memorial Healthcare District ("PMHD").

RECITALS

- A. Effective as of August 21, 2006, the Parties entered into a Healthcare Services Agreement ("Agreement") under which PMHD provides certain healthcare services for qualified students of ICCD ("Covered Services"). Pursuant to the Agreement, some of those Covered Services are available at PMHD's main Brawley campus as well as at its clinics located in the communities of El Centro and Calexico.
- B. PMHD has since closed its El Centro clinic.
- C. The Agreement at Section B 4 requires PMHD, at its sole cost and expense, to maintain professional liability (malpractice) insurance in a minimum amount of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) per occurrence and Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) annual aggregate.
- D. The Agreement at Section G 7 permits PMHD to contract with other healthcare providers to provide some or all of the Covered Services.

- E. Clinicas de Salud de Pueblo, Inc., a California not for profit corporation, is a federally qualified health clinic ("Clinicas"). It operates a clinic in El Centro, California. Clinicas is able and willing to provide the Covered Services at its El Centro clinic for PMHD.
- F. PMHD is negotiating an agreement with Clinicas to provide the Covered Services at its El Centro Clinic to replace the PMHD clinic in El Centro which is being closed.
- G. The parties desire to amend the Agreement to provide that the professional liability insurance required thereunder will be One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) annual aggregate.
- H. The parties desire to acknowledge that Clinicas will provide the Covered Services at its El Centro clinic for PMHD.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. The introductory paragraph of Section B 4 is hereby revised in its entirety and will now provide as follows:

"4. <u>Insurance</u>. PMHD, at its sole cost and expense, shall maintain during the term of this Agreement and, if coverage is provided on a claims-made basis, for a period of seven (7) years after termination of this Agreement, professional liability (medical malpractice) insurance in a minimum amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) annual aggregate."

Section B 4 subparagraphs a) and b) shall remain the same.

- 2. The parties acknowledge that PMHD is entering into an agreement with Clinicas to provide Covered Services at its El Centro clinic for PMHD.
- 3. Except as modified by this First Amendment, the other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain the same and in full force and effect.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have executed this First Amendment to Healthcare Services Agreement as of the date first set forth above.

V.7. Resolution No. 14452: Second Amendment to Healthcare Services Agreement

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board approves the following agreement:

SECOND AMENDMENT TO HEALTHCARE SERVICES AGREEMENT Imperial Community College District and Pioneers Memorial Healthcare District

This Second Amendment to Healthcare Services Agreement is effective as of August 1, 2009, by and between Imperial Community College District ("ICCD") and Pioneers Memorial Healthcare District ("PMHD").

RECITALS

- A. Effective as of August 21, 2006, the Parties entered into a Healthcare Services Agreement ("Agreement") under which PMHD provides certain healthcare services for qualified students of ICCD ("Covered Services").
- B. The term of the Agreement expires as of July 31, 2009.
- C. The parties desire to extend the term of the Agreement and to change the compensation paid to PMHD thereunder.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Section D is hereby revised in its entirety and will now provide as follows:

"D. <u>Compensation</u>. As compensation for the provision of the Services, ICCD shall pay PMHD an amount equal to (a) \$11.50 per Qualified Student for the fall and spring semesters, and (b) \$9.50 per Qualified Student for winter and summer sessions.

- a. During the term of this Agreement such compensation shall be payable within thirty (30) days following the commencement of the applicable semester and/or session during the term of this Agreement. Within thirty (30) days following the end of each semester and/or session, any appropriate adjustments to the compensation shall be made based on the actual census during each such semester and/or session.
- b. ICCD shall retain an annual administrative fee of \$6,000 prior to payment to PMHD. Such administrative fee shall be secured during the fall semester annually."
- 2. Section E of the Agreement is hereby amended to provide that the term shall be extended commencing on August 1, 2009 and terminating on July 31, 2010.
- 3. Except as modified by this Second Amendment, the other terms and conditions of the Agreement and First Amendment shall remain the same and in full force and effect.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have executed this Second Amendment to Healthcare Services Agreement as of the date first set forth above.

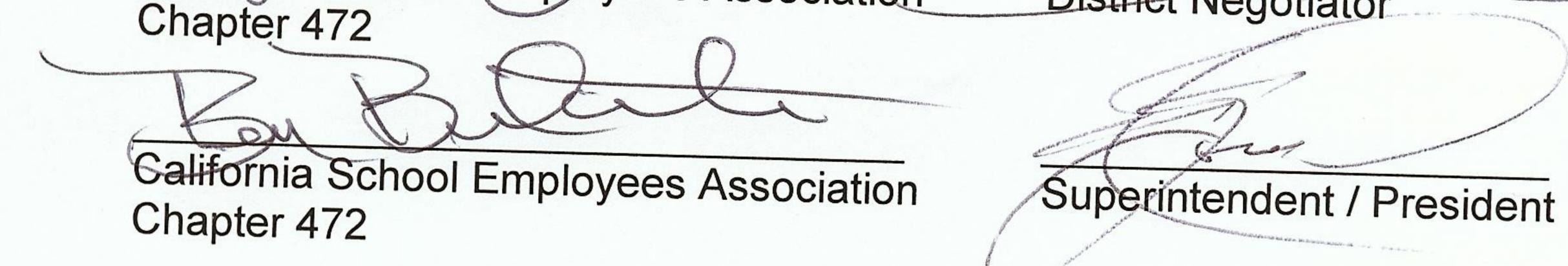
