Dean of Instruction Frank Rapp highlighted Professor of Math Sherry Zobell stating a former student had written to him praising Sherry. He read the student's remarks about Sherry's ability to work with students.

Discussion

Dean Efrain Silva spoke and stated that IVC experienced the loss of a student worker in an accident. He stated staff is still dealing with the loss of Richy as he worked at the Calexico Extended Campus. Dean Silva introduced Richy's grandmother and aunt.

Dr. Gould presented a plaque to the grandmother of Richy as Dean Silva translated to her in Spanish. Richy's grandmother recited a poem by Amado Nervo that reminded her of Richy, her grandson, and thanked everyone for the gesture.

VP for Academic Services Berry presented the Foundation for California Community Colleges award for her dedicated services to the Foster Youth programs. VP Berry read a letter from the Foundation for California Community Colleges.

Director Green thanked the Board.

WRITTEN COMMUNICATION

Board President Ramirez announced that the Board received two written communications: one from Jane Higginson, Instructor of Environmental Science (RE: Leave of Absence, letter dated August 7, 2008) and the other a Memorandum of Understanding between the District and IVC Chapter 472 (RE: Reclassifications, dated August 13, 2008).

INFORMATION REPORTS

Board Member Reports

Trustee Galindo reported the following:

- Welcomed staff back.
- She stated there were a lot of things going on this summer and announced most of the school districts have started or are in the process of staff development. She stated this year would be interesting due to pressures regarding SLOs and there are a lot of issues that will impact the college directly.
- She announced she intends to travel to Washington DC for the 4th Annual Leadership Initiative in September. She stated this is an organization that deals with K-16 academic issues especially for children that are of Latino descent. She stated the organization is addressing several issues and one track will discuss language. She stated she wrote a position paper regarding health issues and the impact that has on learning last year. She was unsure whether or not she would write another position paper. She stated she would report to the Board. She stated if our children and young people are not healthy, focusing on health and issues of language learners is an important thing.

<u>Associated Student Government Senate Update – Chantilee Mendenhall</u> ASG President reported the following:

- Friday, August 22, 2008 is the Welcome back luncheon and ASG will be serving hamburgers beverages and will be helping with the activities.
- Finished calendar of events and will be doing voter registration once a week through October 20th, have an information booth the first two days, and host a BBQ luncheon where clubs will be able to promote their club. ASG will hold a Hispanic Heritage Event and a passport acceptance event.
- ASG to become proactive regarding the smoking policy on campus. ASG will be drafting a resolution.

<u>Academic Senate Update – Dr. Bruce Seivertson</u>

Academic Senate President Dr. Seivertson reported the following:

Attended the Basic Skills training held in Newport Beach with three other faculty members.
He stated they attended different sessions such as English and math as part of the basic
skills program and stated the sessions were good experiences. He stated he attended
sessions on CTE, ESL and others. He stated there were over 70 California community
colleges represented. He reported there are two more basic skills training sessions
forthcoming in October.

Monthly Financial Report – John Lau

Vice President for Business Services John Lau reported the following:

- Announced he would present the final fund balance for last year at the next Board meeting.
- Announced the state has not moved on the budget which will cause IVC a cash flow problem. He stated IVC will be using a TRANS, short term borrowing, conservatively borrowing for obligations through November in the amount of \$7.8 million.
- If the budget is approved, then a special Board meeting has been reserved for September. He stated that given the way the state is, he believes there are serious implications and those issues will need to be addressed.

Trustee Cardenas commented that the reserves appear to be down to 7%.

VP Lau stated that there was a feeling that the reserves were too high and should be reduced. He stated that the reserves were committed over a period of time instead of a one-time use as reserves should be used and that has caused them to decrease to 7%. He stated the District does not have a lot of flexibility in terms of the budget. He stated the District has gone through the reserves quickly.

President Gould stated he would address the financial status at the Orientation meeting to staff.

Trustee Galindo asked to identify the position that got IVC to the 7% reserves.

President Gould stated that ongoing commitments out of reserves to salaries caused the lower reserves.

Trustee Cardenas stated he noticed there was a hit of 12% on health.

VP Lau stated there were a couple of things and one part of the cost is that of the 2 + 2 program. He stated he would ask that it sunset next year as it is costly.

<u>President's Update – Dr. Ed Gould</u>

The following was reported under the President's Update:

Executive Assistant Vikki Carr introduced the new President's Office Technician Adriana Sano. She stated Adriana has nine years experience as an office manager in the legal field and her experience will lend itself to good use in the office.

Dr. Gould reported the following:

- Reported that a former Trustee Howard Worthington passed away on Saturday, August 16, 2008. He stated that with the passing of former Trustee Worthington, the community has lost an important founding member of this District. He stated services would be held on Saturday, August 23, 2008.
- Reported that enrollment is flat. He stated there are 10 FTES lower than last year. He
 stated a possibility is that the District is enforcing fees which may be part of the reason for
 the enrollment. He stated the District should be okay financially. He stated the state only
 paid us for part of our growth. He stated once census is over an analysis will be conducted
 to determine if there is a cause of the decline.
- Reported he conducted a walkthrough of the campus and classrooms today. He stated the campus is generally ready. He stated his expectations are very high. He stated the state of the building reflects how some of the excess in the reserves could have been spent on deferred maintenance and replacement equipment which has not been done. He stated Maintenance and Operations department has done a wonderful job this summer with the improvements they have done to the campus. He stated high speed cable wires were pulled, a complete overhaul of room 315 had been done stating this room is next to the music room and it was a little hard to teach with music next door, a new phone system is being installed, and every classroom will have an emergency phone system soon. He reported the DePaoli fountain repairs will be completed soon.
- Reported some of the redevelopment monies will be used for building improvements.
- Announced the Foundation Annual Luncheon would be held off campus at the Pioneer Museum. He stated the students will not be displaced during the hot weather for this and other events. He invited the Trustees to attend the luncheon.

- Announced the District received \$600,000 in a HUD grant. He stated this grant will help with the cash flow.
- Announced two alerts in legislation. One for SB588 which saves millions of dollars annually
 by eliminating the cost of the DSA. He stated the colleges would still have DSA
 requirements but would save two years of process time. He stated the District is supporting
 the legislation. He stated the District will also support AB518 which would allow concurrent
 enrollment stopping it from sunsetting.
- Praised VP for Academic Services Kathy Berry for her work on Accreditation and the work she is doing with consultants. He stated he wanted to commend her publicly for the work she has done.

Trustee Galindo asked Dean Silva to discuss the \$600,000 grant.

Dean Silva stated the HUD Grant would be connected with the IID grant for \$300,000 and will be able to provide businesses with operational expenses for start up costs. He stated the grant is for three years and most of the money is for grant funding, opening a business center, and purchasing 15 computers. He stated he would do a full presentation at the September Board meeting.

Trustee Acuna asked how the DSA project would streamline the process.

President Gould explained that it would bypass some of the process that causes the delays through DSA as projects are not approved locally.

Student Center Feasibility Study - John Lau

Vice President for Business Services John Lau stated that Parsons had presented a unique idea for a partnership with IVC in terms of building a student center. He stated it was a public/private partnership which would have a statue of limitations negotiated for two or three years. He stated there is a need for a student center and stated the District is not in a position to pursue the building of the center. He stated that the District is recommending the consideration for the feasibility study as it would not cost the District any money.

President Gould stated an item would be on the September Board agenda to consider a feasibility study with Parsons.

Trustee Galindo asked if Parsons is related or the same company that is actively against the firefighters. President Gould stated there is no relationship with the companies and he would receive a statement from Parsons stating so.

Trustee Galindo stated she does not feel the study would be done in good faith if the District plans on sitting on the study. She stated she does not feel the District is in a position given the fiscal report and the coming years the District will endure fiscally.

Board President Ramirez asked ASG President Mendenhall about their desire for the student center.

ASG President Mendenhall stated that ASG would be conducting a survey as to whether or not students would support a possible \$10 fee which would go toward a student center.

Board President Ramirez stated that students had voiced their need for a student center.

President Gould stated VP for Student Services Jaime and Associate Dean Lopez were out on a conference and they have further information on the needs of the center.

Trustee Galindo asked if the \$10 fee would be a one-time registration fee or an ongoing fee. President Gould stated it would be ongoing.

Trustee Galindo stated she is cognizant of the needs of the students and stated she would like to see the expense of the center.

President Gould suggests that a resolution would be proposed at the next meeting.

VP for Business Services Lau stated that he agrees that financing should be looked at conservatively but the District should also look at creative ways for financing.
