Parliamentarian

President Sciaky stated that during the CCCSAA conference they would have fun, but will also have to work hard. No one is allowed to leave the Hotel and everyone must clean up after themselves. Notes must be taken from each session attended.

President Sciaky stated that he had received an e-mail from Frances Beope, District Head Counselor regarding admissions to SDSU Calexico campus reducing 10.8% enrollment and that SDSU Main campus was reduction was less, but Mr. Lopez clarified that both campuses SDSU main and Calexico campus were cut 10.8% . That is over 750 Freshmen Transfer students being cut. The San Diego State main campus is also requiring freshmen to live in dorms. Mr. Lopez recommends to those that are going to transfer to keep above a 3.5 grade point average. Next year will be tougher for students to transfer to Universities; therefore, it will get very competitive.
