Perkins Title IC CTEA Grant

The Perkins CTEA allocation was decreased during the 2nd quarter, and then increased in the 3rd quarter. 12 career technical education (CTE) programs were funded in 11-12. Funding helped supplement the approved programs in many ways, ie, by purchasing equipment and providing professional development opportunities. Funding is based on CTE student headcount, core indicator data, and performance. This year, 4,369 was reported as the number of CTE students at IVC.

The EWD office has submitted the 12-13 Perkins CTEA grant application and has received preliminary approval with positive comments.

National Science Foundation



Rick Johnson continues to work as the Principal Investigator for the NSF grant. He has been conducting periodic tours of local hydro electric plants, solar fields, and the Imperial Dam.

Workforce Development Training Programs

There are currently four Workforce Investment Act (WIA) training programs at IVC. These are: EMT II, B-GREEN II, Dental Assistant II, and SMOG.

13 EMT I students earned a National Registry Emergency Medical Technician License and 11 are now employed. EMT II began in May and has 21 students.



Training for the Dental Assistant I program has ended. 14 students completed the program successfully and are currently working either as interns or employees. The Dental Assistant II program started in June and has 21 students enrolled.



B-GREEN II (Building Green Retrofitted Energy Efficient Neighborhoods) began in January and 39 students are currently enrolled. Flyer

The SMOG program began in March. 14 students are enrolled and are currently preparing to take the ASE exams.

CTE Transitions

234 students from several local high schools were given Credit by Exams in the areas of allied health, business, building construction, computer info systems, administration of justice, and agriculture engineering technology. About half of the exams were completed successfully. Upon successful completion of the exams, IVC registration, and payment of fees, the students will get fall College credit for those courses.
