Business Department

The new **CISCO** program is scheduled to begin next semester. The CISCO computer lab is completed. We are currently recruiting for a new CIS instructor.

Public Safety Department

IVC Public Safety is **certified** thru the CA Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) to train individuals in the Regular Basic Course Modular Format Level II and III courses. This training can lead to a career as a Reserve Peace Officer or prepare the student for the final part of their training to be a full-time Peace Officer.

Industrial Technology Department

The Auto Tech Dept. is in the process of becoming **NATEF** certified. A NATEF inspection is expected later in the fall.

Apprenticeship Programs

Sixty one apprentice students attended in the spring. Thirty seven of those that completed all courses went on to take and pass their journeyman exams and were presented with their **journeyman certificates** on October 18th.

New CTE Building

Groundbreaking for the new CTE Building is expected later this fall. A 19-month construction phase is expected. We look forward to our new **state-of-the-art facility** to improve the quality of education for our students.

The new building will house new labs for Air-Conditioning & Refrigeration, Building Construction, Electrical Wiring, Electronics, Welding, Administration of Justice, and POST.

Re-modernization funds will be used to improve the Automotive Technology instructional lab.
