American Sign Language 100 Syllabus - Spring 2010

Course Description:

An introduction to American Sign Language and finger spelling. The course will focus on conversational skills, grammar, and vocabulary as it are used in the Deaf community. Deaf culture will be examined.

Attendance Policy:

Attendance is crucial. If you miss more than three classes in a row, you must bring valid documentation (doctor's note, jury duty notice, etc.) to the next class meeting or you may be dropped from the course.
