Goal A: The Academic Senate, through the Curriculum Committee, will develop 1-3 exploratory, meta-majors for incoming students: Public Health, Public Safety, and Education. These new majors will include a common, first-semester experience that includes Math and English Composition.

Goal B: The Vice President for Student Services will oversee a review and modification of the online application process for incoming students which replaces the extensive list of available majors to a more user-friendly process beginning with broad categories which lead to exploratory, meta-majors or to a specific major selected by the student.

Goal C: Admissions and Counseling will work together to improve student contacts during the students' first semester so that at least 70% of first-semester students complete a Comprehensive Student Educational Plan (CSEP) by the end of the first semester.

Goal D: The Academic and Student Services deans will work together to improve communication among and between teaching and counseling faculty to better monitor student progress during the students' first year so that interventions from faculty can improve student persistence and success.

Goal E: The District will increase the number of sections offered in transfer-level Math, English, and Science to reduce backlog of students waiting for class openings.
