Transition Fair Breakout Sessions

ResCare Workforce Services (RWS)

RWS offers education, vocational training and job placement for Youth between 14-24 years old through WIA Youth and @LIKE programs. The educational and vocational training services prepare people in personal, career and life management. RWS is the provider of youth services through the Imperial County One Stop – Business & Employment Services. The Imperial County Youth Program offers youth valuable opportunities such as work readiness workshops, work experience, leadership training, educational goal-setting, and counseling. Program coordinators work closely with participants to address their specific needs, interests and any barriers. Youth are provided with services and support that help them in meeting their goals.

Dress for Success

The way we dress has remarkable impact on the people we meet professionally or socially and greatly (sometimes crucially) affects how they treat us. In this presentation, you will receive the information you need to create your professional image.

Center for Employment Training(CET)

CET training is designed to meet the needs of people over the age of 18 who want to learn a skill and find a job. At CET, the goal for each student is a permanent, unsubsidized job with benefits and growth potential. CET's unique mode of job training involves an integration of skill training, basic skills instruction (including vocational English as a second language), human development, job preparation and job placement assistance, conducted in a simulated work setting.

In addition to accessible, flexible, timely, affordable, hands-on, highly individualized and self-paced training, we offer life skills instruction, workplace simulation, human development, supportive services and job placement assistance.

Imperial Valley College Financial Aid Office

IVC offers a full array of financial aid programs- grants, work study, scholarships, and fee waivers (we do not participate in the federal loan programs). These programs are available to both full and part time students who are seeking a degree or certificate. We have financial aid available to help you with tuition, fees, books and supplies, food, housing, transportation, and childcare.

Imperial Valley College DSPS and Workability III Program

Disabled Student Programs and Services is designed to provide supportive services to students with physical disabilities, learning disabilities, psychological disabilities, developmental delay, acquired brain injury, visual impairments, health problems and to students that are deaf and hard of hearing. The program provides priority registration, counseling, class scheduling, mobility assistance, interpreting, alternate text production, adaptive physical education, special parking, and health and wellness assessments.

Job Corps

The San Diego Job Corps is a no-cost education and career technical training program administered by the [U.S. Department of Labor](https://www.dhs.gov/u-s-department-of-labor) that helps young people ages 16 through 24 improve the quality of their lives through career technical and academic training. At the San Diego Job Corps Center, we support the Job Corps program's mission of teaching eligible young people the skills they need to become employable and independent and placing them in meaningful jobs or further education.

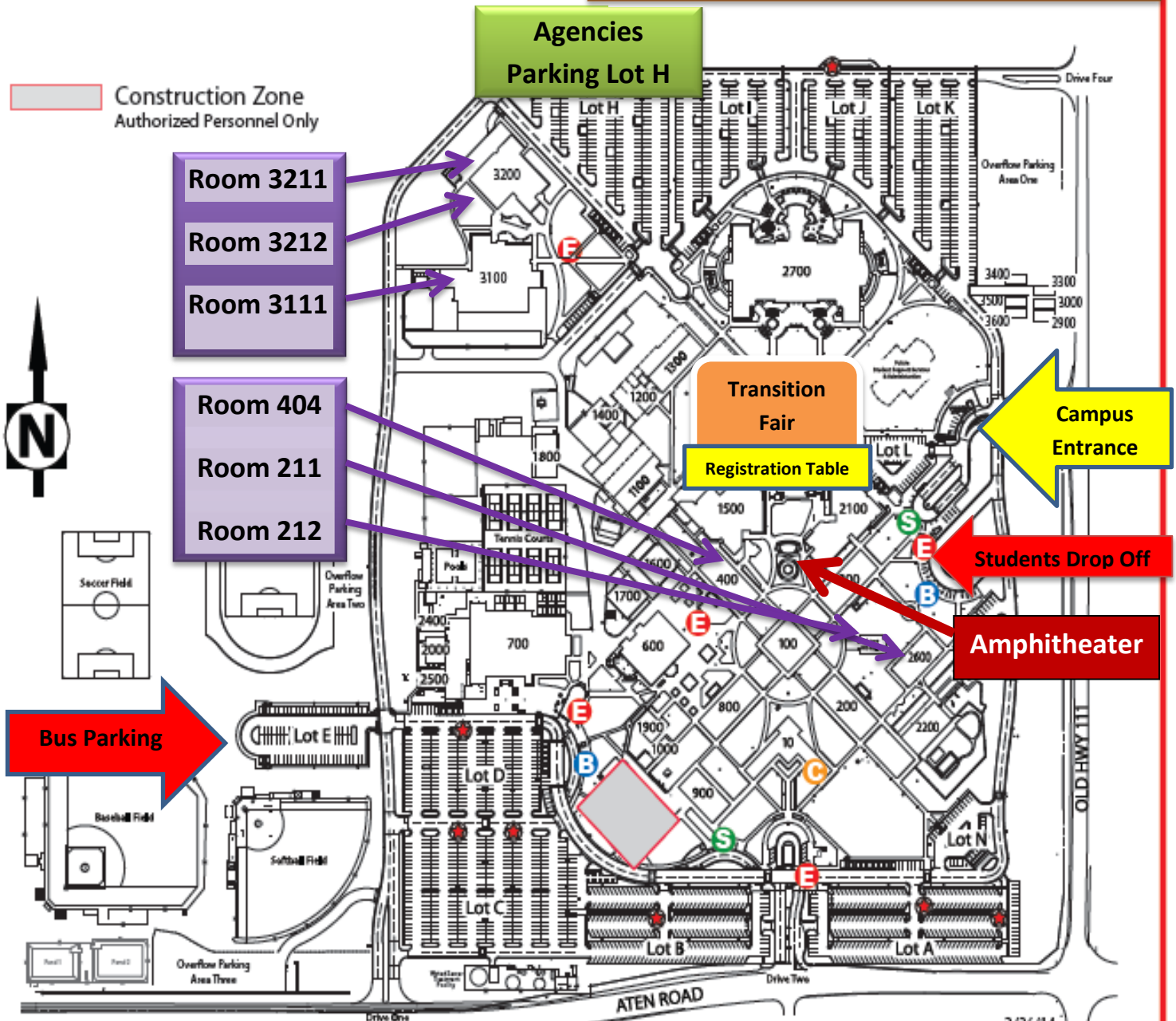
