(Please see instructions).		514 students completed a survey at the end of the Fall 2012 semester regarding SLO3. 507 (99%) of the students surveyed stated that their Fall 2012 POLS 102 course provided them with information which helped them to better understand the American election and voting process. 299 (58%) of the students surveyed participated in activities associated with the 2012 Presidential Election. Activities included Voter Registration Drives, Get Out the Vote (GOTV) activities, volunteering for political campaigns, working at the Polls on Election Day, working at the Imperial County Elections Department. 215 (42%) of the students participated in classroom assignments researching campaign issues and writing essays regarding candidates and issues. Overall, 99% of the students participating in the SLO3 activities stated that the experience improved their understanding of the American election and voting process and 97% stated that the experience improved their understanding of government and public policies. Overall, a majority of students felt that the activities enhanced their classroom learning, improving their understanding of the American election and voting process (99%), and their understanding of government and public policies (97%).  POLS 102 instructors will continue to work together to develop innovative ways to enhance student learning of American government and politics.

Student comments indicate that a majority of students enjoyed learning more about elections and voting, and appreciated the opportunity to participate in activities which benefited our community and nation. Student voter participation increased from 23% in the June 2012 Primary Election to 70% in the November General Election. This process definitely supported the course goal of fostering informed, responsible participation in public life.</p> <p>This was the first time SLO3 has been assessed. Faculty will meet to discuss strategies prior to the next cycle assessment of SLO3, which may involve some adjustments to the assessment document and process.</p>

Faculty teaching POLS 102: American Government & Politics in Fall 2012 participated in the assessment of the following course Student Learning Outcome:

**SLO 3: Examine the election and voting process.**

The Fall 2012 course offerings of POLS 102 included seventeen (17) sections, offered by six (6) faculty members (full and part time). The Student Learning Outcome was demonstrated by the following tasks:

1. Students were to participate in activities that provided them with opportunities to examine the election and voting process, as assigned by their instructor.

4. Students were to take a survey at the end of the class to assess the SLO activities.

**Student Survey Results**

514 students participated in the survey. 507 students (99%) stated that their POLS 102 course provided them with information which helped them to better understand the American election and voting process. 299 students (58%) participated in activities associated with the 2012 Presidential Election.
