Questions by Category

1.0 WARM UP QUESTIONS

1.1 How many of you have either attended IVC or have had a family member attend IVC? (Follow-up to affirmative answers: How many of you are CURRENTLY students at IVC?)

One lady had taken two art classes at IVC. Two other gentlemen said that they had a lot of exposure to IVC, but did not mention whether they had taken classes or not.

1.2 What part of the video or fact sheet surprised you?

Information was new to some people.

- 1.3 What part of the video or fact sheet did you dislike (or disagree with)?
 - The small fact sheet was very well received; a suggestion for a map on the fact sheet was made.
 - The quality of the video presentation was poor, it was stated by several people there.
 - Field trips for some classes should have been shown on the video.
 - The content of the video was otherwise praised: "Good information" "I learned a lot about IVC from the video." " The historical perspective was excellent."

2.0 IVC'S LINKAGE TO TOTAL DISTRICT

- 2.1 What do you think of the relationship between IVC and the Imperial Valley at large?
 - There was a period a few years ago when the image of IVC was at its lowest
 - It's reputation is on hold now; it seems to be improving.
 - It is a good "feeder" school for students who have little money but have a desire to get a four year college education.
 - The museum is revered and should be opened. It would bring people to Ocotillo. It would attract tourists.
 - It was suggested that the museum could hold other collections than what it has now.
- 2.2 What is the best role IVC can play in Imperial County?
 - We do not have to worry about the cost of education at IVC.
 - When there was a paleontology department at IVC, there was more community interest.
 - There were archeological field trips. This should be part of the new IVC also.

3.0 IVC'S LINKAGE TO SPECIFIC COMMUNITIES

- 3.1 What do you think of the relationship between IVC and your community?
 - Ocotillo at one time had several classes in arts and crafts and field trips for community.
 - Transportation to the main campus is a major issue for seniors and young alike.
 - Several comments were made to the effect that in recent years Ocotillo felt left out.
 - They viewed the focus group as an indication of renewed interest by IVC in Ocotillo.
- 3.2 What changes do you see in your community? How is IVC responding? How should it respond?

- Ocotillo has had an influx of younger people and they need access to IVC.
- Some good classes might include: carpentry, plastering, masonry, electrical.
- Construction classes to build houses and auction them off.
- Classes on state regulatory permits, especially concerning water management.
- 3.3 What is the reputation of IVC in your community?
 - On hold now. Very bad in the last couple of years. There was a lot of bickering.
 - The reputation of backbiting and fault finding killed the last bond issue.
 - It is turning around.
 - IVC was getting in its own way.
 - Quality of instructors is excellent. This was especially true of community programs.
 - Faculty should get out into the community.
- 3.4 How has IVC contributed to your community? What do you think about those contributions?
 - Significant contribution up to now.
 - There is natural attitude of the faculty. But should become more visible to community.
 - One lady stated that frequently needed classes are not available at IVC. She has to drive to San Bernardino to take a class on grant writing.
- 3.5 What is the best role IVC can play in your community?
 - Participate in the improvement of English language usage in the county. This problem is not just with non-native speakers. Public service is often hampered by poor understanding and use of English.

- Remedial classes; stress articulation and clear expression
- Offer more community classes.

- 3.7 How can IVC overcome distance issues to serve your community?
 - Improved bus service is needed to the main campus so that more people can participate.
