
What is the C.A.T.C. Credential?

It is a credential which identifies the academically trained counselor who is able to facilitate behavioral change for persons affected by alcohol and other drug addictions. It will signify to a potential employer or colleague that the person possessing this credential has completed the academic and experiential requirements for a certificate in Alcohol and Drug Studies, in a state accredited, CAADE approved program. The C.A.T.C. Credential will also identify a person who has practical experience in the area of evaluation and assessment, treatment planning, pharmacology of alcohol and other drugs, cultural issues and their relevance, models of intervention, family issues, legal and ethical issues, referrals and record keeping.

CAADE is one of the credentialing organizations included in the State of California Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs directory meeting the minimum criteria for Alcohol and Drug Counseling.

Requirements for the C.A.T.C. Credential

- 1) Possession of the Alcohol/Drug Studies Certificate from one of the state accredited and CAADE approved programs.
- 2) A comprehensive examination must be taken and passed. The examination will be held twice a year in appropriate geographical areas. The cost of this test is a non-refundable \$70 for members, \$200.00 for non-members payable by certified bank check or money order only. Call the C.A.T.C. Credentialing Coordinator for test application information which will be mailed to you. After July 1, 2010 the C.A.T.C. exam will be available on-line. Special fees and regulations will apply for on-line testing.
- 3) Within 3 years after successfully passing the examination, a completed application form and the appropriate fees for two years (\$175.00), payable by certified bank check or money order only. (No personal or business checks accepted!)
- 4) For initial certification, documented verification of two thousand two hundred forty supervised hours of work experience in the field must be summarized on the designated CAADE forms(s). These 2240 hours of supervised experience must be completed within 3 years after passing the test. (College internship hours may be included in this total.)
- 5) Three (3) letters of character reference from three (3) different sources other than current place of employment or family members.
- 6) Signed agreements to abide by a Code of Ethics and a defined Scope of Practice. (These forms to be provided by CAADE.)
- 7) At the end of 2 years, this credential may be renewed for two (2) years for \$256.00 (includes 2 years CAADE membership), or \$300.00 for non-members, plus proof of completion of forty (40) Continuing Education Hours from any CAADE approved conference, workshop, or training course in the field of AOD, and/or attendance at any semester course in a CAADE approved ADS college program. Information on approved courses may be had by calling 909-594-5611 ext. 4654.
- 8) Individual CAADE membership is required; subsequent renewals must include a signed code of ethics and scope of practice.

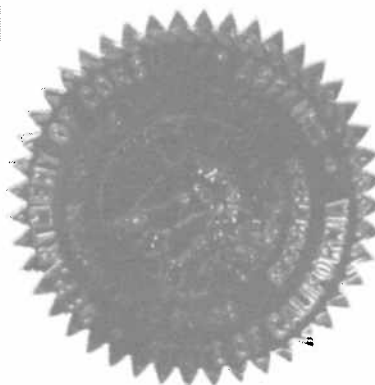
