- **Incarcerated Population:**
 - Imperial County Jail – 480 +/-
 - Calipatria State Prison – 3,623 +/-
 - Centinela State Prison – 3,044 +/-
- **Annual Cost:** \$60,000/prison inmate
- **Average Education:** 10th grade

Social Change through Transformative Education

The Inside-Out Program creates avenues for social change through education and civic engagement. By generating opportunities for incarcerated and college students to come together and learn in the same classroom, Inside-Out opens the door for people to gain an education that emphasizes collaborative learning and problem-solving.





Legislative Action

- **AB109/AB117**
 - 2011 Public Safety Realignment
 - Reduce overcrowding, costs, and recidivism
- **AB86**
 - Adult Education initiative
 - To better serve the educational needs of adults
- **AB1271**
 - Introduced by Assemblyman Bonta
 - Would allow community colleges to offer educational courses at state prisons
