PUBLIC COMMENTS Student Success Specialist, Ms. Bianca Bisi introduced herself to the

Senate. She is currently working under Student Equity serves as the Student Homeless Liaison which focuses on addressing food security

on campus for students in need.

Dr. Garcia emphasized the importance and the obligation she has in dealing with providing a food pantry for students. The Chancellor is

aware that this is a real problem. Several colleges have already

implemented food pantries at their campuses.

The plan is to have the pantry open twice a week and this will be on an income base. Proof of income will not be required by IVC employees. Daily "Grab and Go Packs" will be available to all students regardless of their income. The packs may contain a granola or energy bar, water, soup, etc. The food pantry will be an official distribution site on behalf of the Imperial Valley Food Bank which means we will not turn away people from the community who come on campus seeking assistance. Dr. Garcia was clear to state that ASG will not be responsible of the

food pantry but would appreciate any assistance she can get. The center will not be advertised in the community. Boxes of food in the amount of \$25 will be ordered with anticipation. Dr. Garcia encourages students to bring any concerns to her.

Data will be collected to see what the need on campus is. Dr. Garcia is open to ideas. A new distribution center on Aten Road will be open soon but this will not be a viable solution for students to drive or take public transportation to and from the center. The food pantry will be located in the old mail room and Dr. Garcia will be assigning employees to handle the pantry. Microwaves will also be available for students. She encourages Senators interested in this idea to contact her as there is a possibility to travel to San Bernardino to see how the pantries are handled.

The Senate thanked Dr. Garcia and Ms. Bisi for their time and they excused themselves at 1:22 p.m.
