Future Goals 2017-2017

President Bermudez gave a presentation of student needs as well as a list of special projects. The senate should consider at least one special project to work on.

Dr. Johnson looked over the list and determined at least three top projects and recommended the senate to look for funds and resources for the special projects.

Dr. Johnson went on to inform the senate that a microwave will come in June or July when the food pantry is open in order to accommodate students who bring their lunch from home.

Vote of No Confidence

Senator Espejo Rodarte informed the senate that Mr. Martinez was the previous advisor for the ASG and had personal issues with Dr. Garcia, Vice President of Student Services. Senator Espejo Rodarte went on to inform the senate that Dr. Garcia is someone who has poor leadership skills and the character of a leader is extremely important. Senator Espejo Rodarte stated that the goal of the vote of no confidence was that Dr. Garcia formally apologize to the ASG, the student body, Mr. Martinez and the school as a whole. Senator Espejo Rodarte went on to state that Dr. Garcia cannot get away with things like this and is not taking this as a personal position but is speaking for all students of Imperial Valley College.

President Bermudez informed the senate that there have been cases with students having issues with Dr. Garcia and forms of retaliation had already been seen.

Secretary Deol informed the senate during the discussion of the food pantry, concerns were voiced and Dr. Garcia implied that she did not care about the students' opinion.

President Bermudez went on to add that she had heard complaints from students and employees who did not want to come forward stating that Dr. Garcia had cursed at them.

Dr. Johnson told the senate that he appreciated their sentiments and can only speak on his observations and experiences. He went on to inform the senate that every day, he reflects on his day and what could he have done better. He went on to state that one thing he does know of Dr. Garcia is a hard worker, is engrained in the community, organizations and has helped a lot of people.

Dr. Johnson went on to inform the senate that one of the bigger projects Dr. Garcia has been working on is the food pantry which will assist with student success. Additionally he encouraged the ASG to work with Dr. Garcia.

Dr. Johnson went on to advise the senate that taking this step will challenge things and encouraged the senate to work with Dr. Garcia and hopes things get better with time. Additionally, he asked what the outcome of this would be and with the some ASG members seeking Dr. Garcia's termination, he asked the ASG how the rest of the campus and student body would feel.

A motion was made by senator Espejo Rodarte and a second by senator Deol for a vote of no confidence in Dr. Garcia.

Discussion:

Senator Gonzalez informed the senate that once feelings are on the table, the issue is personal. Dr. Garcia is getting things done on campus and the vote of no confidence may make things difficult for future senates. Gonzalez went on to add that this would be putting the new senate in issues that they were not involved in.

President Bermudez informed the senate that there was an attempt to resolve issues that were discussed however Dr. Garcia would not meet with the ASG. President Bermudez added that Dr. Garcia is on track to be the next Superintendent of IVC and already thinks she is queen adding that Dr. Garcia only does things to make herself look good.

Senator Espejo Rodarte added that Dr. Garcia is stepping on people to get things done.

Senator Gonzalez informed the senate that he disagreed with the vote and this issue was a personal issue with Dr. Garcia.

Irene Drye stated that she understands the ASG's views however there have been many projects and programs that Dr. Garcia has been a part of to improve campus life at IVC as well as assisting with special groups on campus and working on partnerships.
