H. Action Items

1. Remove Bylaws requirement for petitions in At-Large Senator elections and shorten timeline.

Section 6. At-Large Senators.

- **A.** The Senate shall consist of an appropriate number of members to allow representation from each Division and Part-Time faculty area, together with the maintenance of at least nine At Large representatives, in accordance with the Senate Bylaws.
- B. All members of the electorate are eligible to serve as At-Large Senators. At-Large Senators may be nominated by Division Voting Units, as specified in the Constitution, or by self-nomination. petition. Petitions may be circulated and signed by any member of the electorate, but no member of the electorate may sign more than one petition to be submitted for any one election. Petitions must be specific and include the signatures of the proposed nominee, the nominator and the seconder, each of whom must be a member of the Senate Electorate. Petitions bearing at least twenty (20) additional qualified signatures and Nominations submitted to the Senate Elections Committee at least fifteen (15) seven (7) days prior to distribution of the Senate ballot, shall qualify the specific nominee for inclusion in the election.

2. Approval of Extension to Incomplete Grade deadline

Currently, "An incomplete contract may be negotiated for UNFINISHED WORK, OTHERWISE PASSING indicating that because of medical or other sufficient reason an important assignment such as a term paper, final examination, or experiment is missing.

"In incomplete ('I') grade, which is not made up by the end of the sixth week of the next regular semester (emphasis added), shall be converted to a letter grade. The letter grade shall be used in computing grade point average.

"Incomplete symbols should be assigned for academic work under unforeseeable, emergency and justifiable reasons at the end of the term" (College Catalog, 37).
