D. Communications

- 1. NAU Yuma SEEDS Scholarship Program Francisco Villa
 - ✓ Chair Gilison introduced Dr. Francisco Villa of Northern Arizona University.
 - ✓ Dr. Villa passed out two handouts; Science Program and Supporting Educational Endeavors for Degrees in Science (SEEDS) Scholarship.
 - Science Program Dr. Villa stated that they have a branch campus at Arizona Western College. Building is dedicated strictly for science courses.
 - ✓ Handle all other division science courses. Designed for students to complete their Associate Degree in Science.

- ✓ Looking for students to transition to NAU.
 - Students need to complete one year of general chemistry.
 - One year of general biology.
 - Math requirements calculus, calculus I.
 - Ideally complete one year of physics, and at least one semester of organic chemistry.
- ✓ Encourage students transferring from Arizona Western or IVC to complete IGETC. This means you met all your GE requirements.
- SEEDS Scholarship Northern Arizona University Yuma Branch Campus was awarded \$600,000 grant in 2015 from the National Science Foundations (NSF) for scholarships for science.
 - Grant will support a cohort of 15 students for two years.
 - Scholarships will be awarded (based upon need) up to \$10,000 per year.
 - Cohorts will participate in natural history field trips, scientific meetings, job fairs, internships, and research-related activities.
 - Eligible students will have a declared major in Biological Sciences or Environmental Science, demonstrate academic talent and financial need and are U.S. citizens or permanent residents.
- ✓ Encouraged faculty to visit website for more information or contact him.
- 2. SLOs
 - ✓ Reminded everyone that if they're accessing SLOs this semester to make sure they're done by the end of this semester and entered into SPOL.
 - ✓ Also reminded faculty that J. Kitzmiller, SLO coordinator talked about reducing number of SLO's that we have to make them more streamlined for all of our courses. This is something D. Gilison would like to do but will save for Fall semester.

- ✓ Received some feedback. Biggest change was for ENVS classes. Reduced classes from 9 to 6 for fall semester. Moved some evening classes to morning classes.
