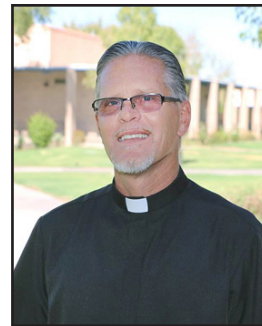

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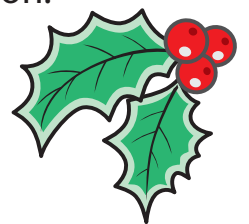

IVC Electrical Technology Program received full program approval from the Department of Industrial Relations. What does it mean?

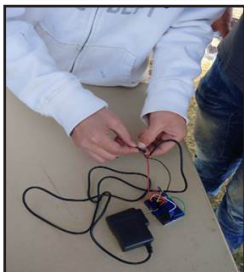


- The MANA Young Ladies Leadership Conference was held on November 3, 2018 on campus.

- Participating labs: Electronics, HVAC, Building Construction, Renewable Energy, and Welding.



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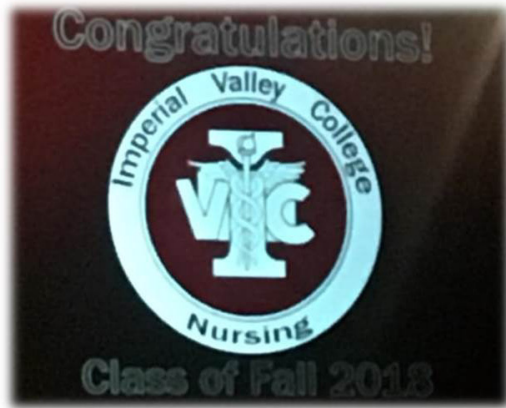

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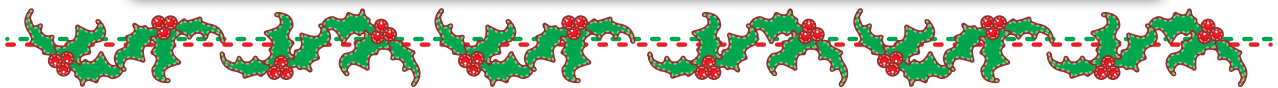

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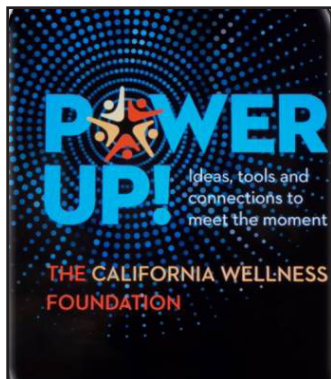

November 12-13, 2018 - Cal Wellness Foundation

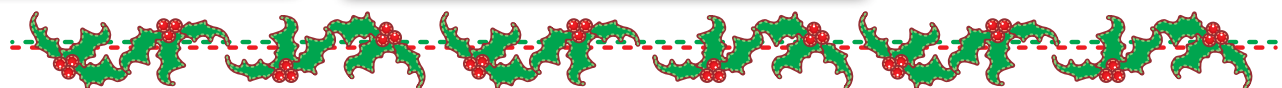
- Alexis Ayala, Student Success Specialist attended Power Up in San Francisco, CA hosted by the Cal Wellness Foundation.

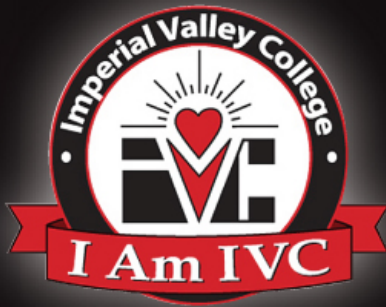

- Upon completion, the students received a laptop.





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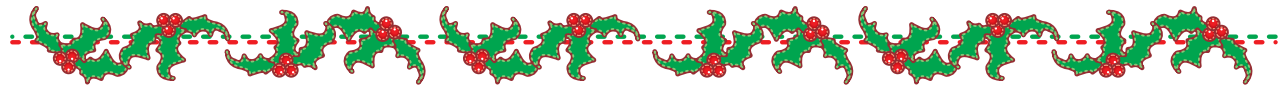

- Integrating classified staff with faculty's student success legislation and initiatives.



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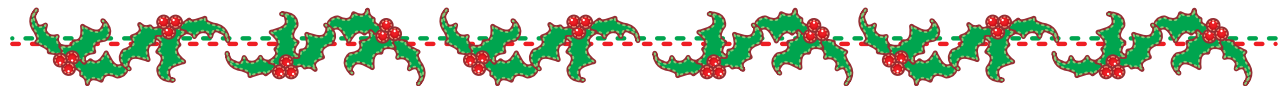

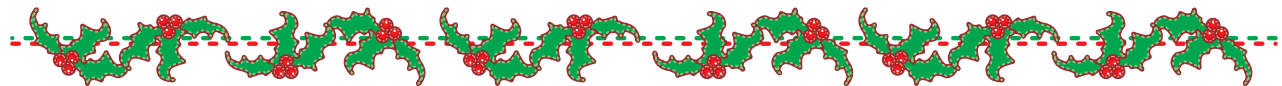

STUDENT UPDATE: LAO FISCAL OUTLOOK

December 6, 2018

- LAO's estimates of revenues and spending indicate the state's constitutional reserve would reach \$14.5 billion by the end of 2019-20.
- Only IF the Legislature and Governor don't commit to any new spending.
- With more commitments, reserves might not fully cover the budget problem.



STUDENT UPDATE

Governor-Elect Gavin Newsom's Emphasis on Cradle to Career

He will push state systems of education to work more closely with each other.

Specific policy proposals:

- Universal preschool for 4-year-olds - \$2 Billion
- 500,000 New Apprenticeships - \$500 Million
- Free Second Year of Community Colleges - \$50 Million
- Higher Education Coordinating Council - \$2 Million
- Longitudinal Data System - \$ 2 Million

No funding source has been identified.

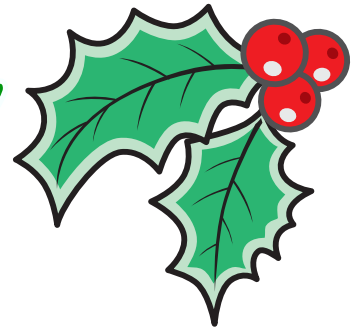
