FUNDING AWARDED BY IMPERIAL COUNTY

- Special thanks to Imperial County Board of Supervisors, Imperial County CEO and employees for your support to Imperial Valley College!
- The following funding was awarded:

1. **\$96,059** from the Imperial County Agriculture Benefit Program (ABP) for IVC Agricultural Education Studies.
2. **\$215,985** from Imperial County Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP) to provide additional services to formerly incarcerated students.
3. **\$242,971** from Imperial County Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP) to provide educational opportunities and remove barriers for underrepresented youth attending IVC.

• New Nursing Student Cohorts for Fall 2019

- The LVN Program accepted 24 students. The expected completion date for this cohort is Spring 2021.
- The RN Program accepted 30 students. The expected completion date for this cohort is Fall 2020.

- **2018-19 Financial Aid**

 - Over 7,700 applications have been received year-to-date.
 - 4,995 students have been awarded for 2019-20.

STATE UPDATE

AB 2 (Santiago) – Would implement provisions of the proposed 2019-20 budget extending free tuition to full time enrolled community college students in their second year of instruction **Passed on to the Senate Appropriations Committee.**



AB 48 (O'Donnell) – Would authorize a statewide general obligation bond to fund K-14 facility construction and modernization to be included on the 2020 primary ballot and the 2022 general election ballot. **Currently in the Senate Government and Finance Committee.**

AB 302 (Berman) – Would mandate that community colleges open up their parking lots to homeless students to camp overnight, unless colleges provide hotel vouchers, rapid rehousing services and housing focused emergency grants. No additional resources were provided to either implement the bill or increase the level of services to homeless students. **Passed on to the Senate Appropriations Committee.**
