- Communication's Professor and Club Advisor Rumaldo Marquez attended with five of his communication students.

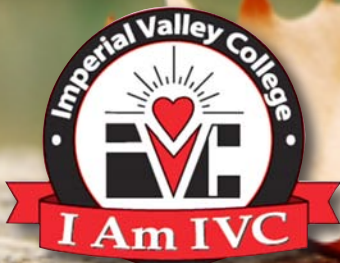

- The group visited San Diego Miramar College, Cuyamaca College, and Palomar College's Rancho Bernardo Center.

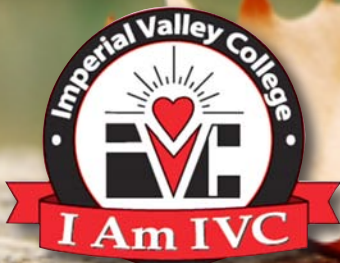

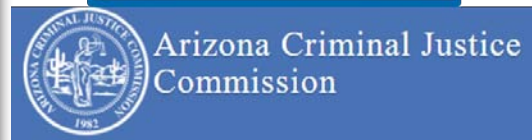

Recently Placed IVC Students/Alumni

ELECTRICAL TECHNOLOGY

DEGREES, CERTIFICATES AND AWARDS
Associate in Science Degree (A.S.)
Certificate of Achievement
Specialization Certificates in Electrical Wiring, Electronics, and Solar Energy

DESCRIPTION
The Electrical Technology program offers an Associate in Science degree, Certificate of Achievement and Specialization Certificates that are designed to provide students with the comprehensive understanding and manipulative skills, technical knowledge, and related trade information required to become technicians or operators in industrial technology and energy related industries or light manufacturing equipment.

This program will allow students to comply with the necessary requirements for certification up to Grade I level. Once the student becomes a state certified operator, he or she will qualify to seek employment in the industrial technology disciplines mentioned in the State. Imperial Valley College has partial program recognition from the Division of Labor Standards for Electrician Certification.

PROGRAM LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. Demonstrate knowledge of safe work practices required installation and repair of electrical wiring.
2. Use written and verbal communication skills to related trade and technical information for wiring.
3. Understand and appreciate the necessary skills to become employed in the electrical field.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE AND CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAMS
The Associate in Arts (AA) or the Associate in Science (AS) Degree involves satisfactory completion of a minimum of 60 semester units with a C average or higher, including grades of C- in all courses required for the major, and sufficient number of all IVC district requirement for the associate degree along with all general education requirements. The degree provides a sound basis for transfer to other colleges/institutions for additional degrees or for higher occupational preparation. In addition students receive an Associate Degree from Imperial Valley College that completes the requirements for the major. The Certificate of Achievement program is designed for students with general or occupational goals who wish early employment. To qualify for the Certificate, a student must satisfy the following requirements: (1) complete all courses listed for a particular certificate, (2) achieve a "C" average (3.0 GPA) for all courses used to complete the certificate, and (3) the Certificate Application form with Admissions and Records by the appropriate deadline based on the application.

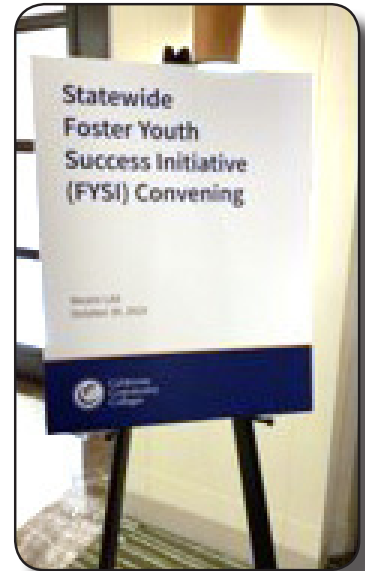

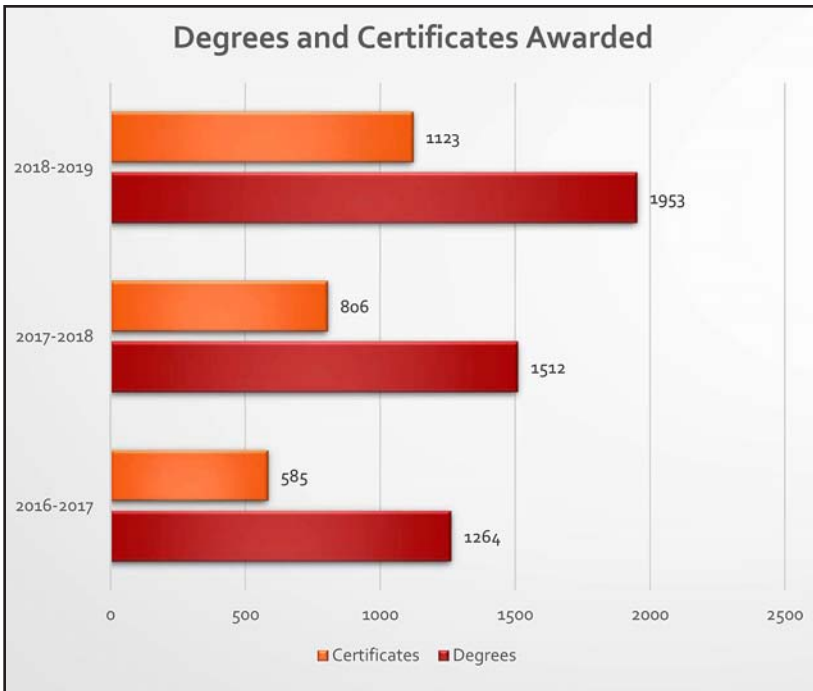
